

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 24th day of *April*, 1956.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of April, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Thorne in the diocese of Sheffield.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area and the church of Saint Wilfrith therein has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and is intended to be consecrated:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution* :

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the church of Saint Wilfrith therein situated.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Wilfrith, Moorends'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery* :

"The said district and parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Doncaster and in the rural deanery of Snaith.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map) of the parish of Thorne which is bounded upon the north and part of the northeast by the parish of East Cowick, upon a further part of the northeast by the parish of Goole and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of East Cowick from the parish of Thorne at the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 37 (on the map) and proceeding thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Reedholme Lane and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Reedholme Lane to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 36 and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence eastwards along the wall or fence forming the southern boundaries of closes numbered 36, 34, 19 and 20 to its end and continuing thence in the same straight line across close numbered 31 to a point in the middle of Moorends Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Moorends Road to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 223 and continuing thence westwards, to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern boundaries of closes numbered 175 and 120 to the junction of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 120 with the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of close numbered 122 and continuing thence first southwards and then southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and

along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned close to its end and continuing thence in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Marsh Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Marsh Lane to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 123 and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern boundaries of closes numbered 121, 173, 226 and 227 and in a straight line in continuation thereof across Black Drain to a point in the middle of Moorends Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Moorends Road to a point in the middle of the level crossing which carries the Hull and Doncaster Branch railway line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) across Moorends Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the said railway line to a point in the middle of the level crossing which carries the said railway line across North Common Road and continuing thence westwards along the middle of North Common Road to its junction with the middle of Thorne and Dikesmarsh Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Thorne and Dikesmarsh Road to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Bloom Hill Road and continuing thence eastwards to and along the middle of Bloom Hill Road to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of close numbered 463 and continuing thence first southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and then southwestwards along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of close numbered 461 to its junction with the northwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the northeastern boundary of close numbered 763 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line eastwards to a point in the middle of the junction of King Edward Road, Green Lane (otherwise Middle Road) and Thorne and Marshland Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Thorne and Marshland Road to a point opposite the middle of the southwestern end of Broadbent Gate Road and continuing thence northeastwards to and along the middle of Broadbent Gate Road to its junction with Moor Lane and continuing thence northeastwards in the same straight line across Moor Drain to a point on the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 792 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned close and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of close numbered 793 to its end and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence forming the southeastern and northeastern boundaries of close numbered 493 for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts and continuing thence in a straight line due eastwards for a distance of 1 chain and continuing thence in a straight line due northwards for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of close numbered 488 and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which forms the southeastern boundary of close numbered 371 to its end and continuing thence first northeastwards then southeastwards along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 370 to its end and continuing thence in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Thorne Waste Drain Road and continuing thence in a straight line northeastwards across Thorne Waste or Moors to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Goole from the parish of Thorne on the northeastern bank of Blackwater Dike 51½ chains southeast of the point on the northeastern bank of the said Dike at which the boundaries of the parishes of Thorne, Goole and East Cowick meet."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in
