

DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL
DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1950.*Direction under Article 4—Durlston, Swanage.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Dorset County Council has with the approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government issued a Direction dated the 31st day of January, 1956, prohibiting any development of the descriptions set out in the Schedule hereto on land at Durlston in the Urban District of Swanage described below and shown edged red on the plan annexed thereto and numbered 3/1/37 unless permission therefor is granted on an application made in that behalf under the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950.

The land referred to is bounded on the North by the Northern boundaries of fields numbered 375 and 331b and by an irregular line running across field numbered 330, to the Northwest corner of field numbered 385, by the Northern boundary of the said field numbered 385, the Western boundary of field numbered 325 to a point approximately 700 feet North of Solent Road and by a line from the said point Eastwards to the Eastern boundary of field numbered 325; on the East by the Eastern boundaries of fields numbered 325, 326, 327 and 386 to a point approximately 1050 feet South of Solent Road; on the South by an irregular line in a Westerly direction from the said point South of Solent Road to the Eastern boundary of field numbered 378, by the Southern boundary of the said field numbered 378 and by a line from the North-West corner of field numbered 380 to the South-West corner of field numbered 375 and on the West by the Western boundary of the said field numbered 375 (Dorset Ordnance Sheet LVII.13—Edition of 1928).

A copy of the said Direction and of the plan defining the land to which it relates may be seen during usual office hours at The Town Hall, Swanage, at the South-East Area Planning Office, The Red Lion Annexe, Wareham, and at the County Hall, Dorchester, Dorset.

And notice is hereby given that the said Direction comes into force on the date on which notice thereof is first published, namely, 9th May, 1956.

THE SCHEDULE referred to.

1. The use of land (other than a building or the curtilage of a building or the site or curtilage of a building which has been demolished in consequence of war damage) for any purpose on not more than 28 days in total in any calendar year, and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the land for the purposes of that use being development comprised within Class IV.2 referred to in Part I of the First Schedule to the said Order and not being development comprised within any other Class.

2. The use of land, other than buildings and not within the curtilage of a dwellinghouse, for the purposes of recreation or instruction by members of an organisation which holds a certificate of exemption granted by the Minister of Health under Section 269 of the Public Health Act, 1936, and the erection or placing of tents or caravans on the land for the purposes of that use being development comprised within Class V referred to in Part I of the First Schedule to the said Order and not being development comprised within any other Class.

DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1950.*Direction under Article 4—Hethfelton near Wool.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Dorset County Council has with the approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government issued a Direction dated the 31st day of January, 1956, prohibiting any development of the descriptions set out in the Schedule hereto on land at Hethfelton in the parish of East Stoke near Wool, described below and shown edged pink on the plan annexed thereto and numbered 3/3/57 unless permission therefor is granted on an application made in that behalf under the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950.

The land referred to is bounded on the North by the main Dorchester—Wareham Road where the road forms the Northern boundaries of fields numbered

354 and 355; on the East by the Eastern boundary of field numbered 355; on the South by the Southern boundaries of fields numbered 355, 354, 393 and 394 and on the West by the Western boundaries of fields numbered 394 and 354 (Dorset Ordnance Sheet XLIX.6—Edition of 1927).

A copy of the said Direction and of the plan defining the land to which it relates may be seen during usual office hours at the Offices of the Wareham and Purbeck Rural District Council, Westport House, Wareham, at the South-East Planning Office, The Red Lion Annexe, Wareham, and at the County Hall, Dorchester, Dorset.

POCKLINGTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Pocklington Rural District (Dolman Field Footpath)
Extinguishment Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 3rd day of May, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way leading from the gate marked A on the plan, near the level crossing on The Green, Pocklington, for a distance of some 70 yards along Dolman Lane to the corner of the Pocklington School buildings, marked B on the plan, and then diagonally for a further distance of 355 yards across Dolman Field in the direction of a tree marked C on the plan to a gap in the hedge in the north east corner of the field formerly used as allotment gardens to the boundary of the Airfield marked D on the plan, and the said right of way shall be extinguished at the expiration of 21 days from the date of confirmation of this Order.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Pocklington, York, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9.0 a.m. and 5.0 p.m. on weekdays except Saturdays, and on Saturdays between the hours of 9.0 a.m. and 12 noon.

The Order becomes operative as from the 10th day of May, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
