Treasury, viz.:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF MEDICAL OFFICERS IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.****1. Age.**

Candidates must be at least 28 years of age on  
1st May, 1956. There is no upper age limit, but in

appointing persons in a permanent capacity Depart-  
ments expect regular and effective service for a  
reasonable period, and the Commissioners will take  
this requirement into account.

**2. Sex and Marriage.**

(i) Both men and women may compete under these  
Regulations, except that in the Prison Commission  
some vacancies will be available for men only and  
some for women only.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been estab-  
lished civil servants and have drawn marriage  
gratuity (other than those who resigned compul-  
sarily on marriage and whose resignation took effect  
before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or  
divorced, or who are separated from their husbands,  
or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery  
from total physical or mental incapacity) will not  
be eligible unless they undertake to refund on  
appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided  
that this undertaking will not be required if the  
break between the first period of service (including  
any period of unestablished service immediately  
following the period in respect of which the gratuity  
was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more  
than seven years.

**3. Nationality.**

Candidates must be British subjects. They must  
also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must  
either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at  
death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions  
and/or been employed elsewhere in the service  
of the Crown for at least five years out of the  
last eight years preceding the date of their  
appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must  
have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or  
been employed elsewhere in the service of the  
Crown for at least five years out of the last eight  
years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this para-  
graph they must satisfy the Commissioners that  
they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's  
dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or resi-  
dence, or by reason of national service, that an  
exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for  
an appointment under the Ministry of Supply unless  
he is a natural-born British subject and born within  
the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing  
Dominions of parents also born within the United  
Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions,  
except when the circumstances are such as to justify  
a departure from the general rule, in which case,  
provided the candidate satisfies the conditions pre-  
scribed by the preceding paragraphs, he may be  
admitted to appointment by special permission of  
the Minister of Supply.

**4. Qualifications.**

Candidates must be fully qualified and registered  
medical practitioners, and should have the particular  
qualifications or experience appropriate to the  
Department or Departments for which they wish to  
be considered. While the minimum age of recruit-  
ment is in general 28, candidates for certain posts  
should have longer experience as a qualified and  
registered medical practitioner than it is possible to  
have at the minimum age.

**Group (a).**

*Ministry of Education.* Candidates must have  
had wide experience in the school health service  
and should preferably have a higher medical  
qualification. Possession of the D.P.H. would be  
an advantage and so would experience in the  
Public Health Service, including epidemiology.

*Department of Health for Scotland.* Head-  
quarters post. Candidates must have had experi-  
ence in the School Health Service and in the care  
of handicapped children. A Diploma in Public  
Health or Child Health is desirable.

**Group (b).**

*Ministry of Health and Welsh Board of Health.*  
Candidates must have had a wide experience of  
general practice. Experience in medical boarding  
or occupational health would be an advantage.  
For the post in the Welsh Board of Health a  
knowledge of the Welsh language is desirable.

Candidates must have had good clinical experience  
and preferably also experience in one or more of
