

the parish of Saint James, Bolton, on the northwest by the area described in Part 1 (a) of this schedule coloured blue on the said map and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Idle, from the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, in the middle of Norman Avenue and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned avenue to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Bolton Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, from the parish of Saint James, Bolton.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill:

"(a) All that part of the parish of Saint John, Idle (coloured red on the map annexed hereto), which is bounded generally on the southeast by the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, on the west by the area described in Part 1 (a) of this schedule coloured blue on the said map and on the north by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Norman Lane opposite the middle of the northern end of Norman Avenue and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Idle, from the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill.

(b) All that part of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, from the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates, in the middle of the bridge which carries the Shipley Branch Line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) over Harrogate Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of Ravenscliffe Avenue and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned avenue to a point opposite the middle of the southwestern end of Delius Avenue and continuing thence northeastwards to and along Delius Avenue to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Roundwood Avenue and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the last mentioned avenue to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Ranelagh Avenue and continuing thence first eastwards and then southeastwards to and along the middle of Ranelagh Avenue to a point opposite the middle of the southwestern end of the road known as Roundwood Glen and continuing thence northeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the southeastern end of the road known as Rimswell Holt and continuing thence due southeast for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts in a straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates, from the parish of Calverley.

"3. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint John, Idle (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies generally to the east of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Idle, from the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle, in the middle of Leeds Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Albion Road and continuing thence westwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the northern end of Old Park Road and continuing thence to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Idle, from the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill.

"4. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John, Idle:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary

which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, from the parish of Saint John, Idle, in the middle of Norman Lane and continuing thence first eastwards and then northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane and along the middle of the road known as 'Bank' to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, from the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded on the northwest by the parish of Saint John, Idle, on the southwest by the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, and on all other sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, from the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates, in the middle of the bridge which carries the Shipley Branch Line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) over Rockwell Lane and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Idlethorp Way and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the road known as Billing View and continuing thence first northeastwards and then northwestwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point opposite the middle of Park Land Drive and continuing thence northeastwards to and along the middle of Park Land Drive to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point opposite the middle of Old Park Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates, from the parish of Saint John, Idle."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bradford.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of May, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cures (hereinafter called 'the said benefices') of Harthill and Aston, both situate in the County of York and in the diocese of Sheffield.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Most Noble John Francis Godolphin, Eleventh Duke of Leeds (hereinafter called 'the said Duke of Leeds'), is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefices:

"And whereas the said Duke of Leeds desires to transfer the advowsons of the said benefices to the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):
