WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of April, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting in the vacancy of the See of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Welford and the benefice of Sibbertoft, both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Welford and the benefice of Sibbertoft shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Welford with Sibbertoft', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Edward Guy Elcock, if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice, and his admission thereto shall be without any form of, or fee for, presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission to the benefice of Sibbertoft.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Welford shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Northampton and in the rural deanery of Haddon."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral

Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of May, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of (1) the advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cures (hereinafter called 'the said benefices') of Snaith and of Pollington with Saint John, Balne, and (2) the interest hereinafter mentioned in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Mary Magdalene, Whitgift, with All Saints, Adlingfleet, all situate in the County of York and in the diocese of Sheffield.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Right Honourable Stephen Nicholas, Fifth Baron Deramore, of The Manor House, Heslington, in the County of York (hereinafter called 'the said Lord Deramore') is entitled to exercise the whole right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Snaith and of Pollington with Saint John, Balne, and the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Whitgift, with All Saints, Adlingfleet.

"And whereas the said Lord Deramore desires to transfer the advowsons of the said benefices of Snaith and of Pollington with Saint John, Balne, and his interest in the advowson of the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Whitgift, with All Saints, Adlingfleet, to the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):
