Yesterday arrived in this Road the Edgar, a thip belonging to North Yarmouth in company of the Golden Falcon and the Argier Merchani bound for London, they came from Legern on the 7th of Septemb r, before whole departure thence, there arrived an English thip from Algiers, affirming, that Sir Thomas Allen came before that place on the fixth of August, and fending in his Boat, had began to Treat; that those of Algier had all their men of War in Port, except only three which are at a place called Bona, and feemed willing to make reftitution of the Moneys formerly taken by some of their men of War out of an English thip bound for the E. Indies, but not agreeing to fome other demands, 'twas not known what the illue of that affair might prove after the end of five days Truce, which had been agreed to by both parties. The Edgar on her way homewards made a little ftop at Tangier and affirms that the Emperour of Morocco had lent a party of 4000 Horfe to conduct His Excellency the Lord Henry Homand to the City of Fez, who was accordingly fet forwards wi h his Train.

Romé; sep. 2x. On Monday laft the Pope, with a great Train of the Princes and Nobility on Horleback, went in Devotion to give a vilit to leveral Churches, and particularly to thole of St Francis, St Auflin, St Maries, and that of the Holy Ghoft, where the lacted Hoft was folemnly expoled, and Prayers made for the prefervation of the City of Candia from the Ottoman forces; and afterwards returned to St Peters in the Vatican; but in paffing the Bridge was pleafed to fpend fome time in taking a view of the excellent Work raifed by his Order, for the Ornament of the faid Bridge, confitting of Ten Angels, excellently cut in Marble by the moft excellent Mafters, each of them holding in their han's a Reprefentation of fome of the Myfleries of the Paffion of our Saviour.

The Marquis de Caftel Rodrigo begins to recover from his indifpolition, which for fome time rendred him uncapable. of entring into possession of the Charge of Matter of the Horle to the Queen.

The King enjoys his Health to the great fatisfaction of the Queen Regent, with the whole Court and Kingdom, and goes often abroad in publick, effectially to the leverat Churches in this City, to fatisfy the people with the view of his perfon.

Great fearch has been made by the Queens special Command after the persons guilty of the Robbery committed in the Kings Chamber of a Cabinet wherein were laid up divers Letters of private and great concernment, but as yet no discovery can be made, the intention of the Robbers are the more apprehended in that they left behind feveral Jewels and things of value, and took away only the Papers.

Don foseph d' Ormaitche who was defigned to have been fent into Flanders as Surintendent or Veedor Goterst of the Province, is lately dead, and as yet no other perion nominated in his Roome. Several perions the most confiderable amongst the Nobility of the Nether ands have been lately nominated to be admitted into the Howorable Society of the Knights of the Golden Fleete, and particularly the Marquis de Trefegnie.

We have late advices from the Coafts of Affrica that the Moors which had blocked up the Fort of Oran, had quitted their defign of laying a close fitge to it, and were marched off to a greater diftance, upon Intelligence given them that the Duke *d' Alcala* General of the Coafts of Andalufia had reinforced the Garrifon with a confiderable number of f eth and able Souldiers, and a proportionable quantity of Provisions and ammunition.

Lisbonne septemb.25. Here is lately Iffued out a Preclamation from the Prince of Portugal faitbly Enjoyning all Officers and Souldiers which feaved in the late war of Spain to repair to the Frontiers, where they are to be admitted to the fame Employments and Commands, which they had before the late peace, and for their Encouragement, papers are affixed in publick places to give them notice that the Frince will make them an allowance for ammunition bread, as was formerly uled to be given them in time of War, which will yield them a lubliftance till moneys shall be raised to pay them their arrears.

The Baron de Battaville the Spanish Ambaffador has defired leave to returne kome, but has not yet obtained a Revocation, but several confiderations have prevailed with the Court of Spain to continue him here for a longer time. His Mighnels, the Prince of Portugal has had thoughts of dispatching some other person to Madrid with the Character only of his Envoye, and Diego Gomes. de Figueredo, an old Collonel of the army has been propoled for that Employment, but as yet not fully resolved on.

The 16th inftant arrived here Diego Lopes Eliva, who for some years past has been an Agent in Holland from this Crown, bringing with him the Treaty last concluded with the States of the United Provinces, containing amongh other things that Cochin and Canonor in the East Indies, shall remain to the States, fo as not to administer for the future any farther dispute : that as to the four Millions due to the States, Portugal is obliged to deliver to them before the end of this present year 1669 as much Salt as shall be valued at One hundred and fifty thousans Crowns of Fortugal, or Three hundred thousand Liures, the States being obliged to fend their thips to transport it, and the rett of the Debt to be fatisfied out of the Salt Cultomes, allowing One hundred and fifty thousand Crowns a year for Twenty years following, and that the Hollanders shall have liberty to fend what ships they please to any part of Brazile, without any Licence either general or particular to be demanded for the fame, provided they go and return with the Portugal Fleen

Abour Six months fince the French Ambeffador gave in a Momorial to the Prince, prefling his Highnefs to grant the King his Maffers Subjects the liberty of a free Trade into his Ports in the Eafl Indies, to which of late an answer was returned him., That his Highnefs will write to his Viceroy of India to Treat the fhips belonging to His moft Chriftian Majefties Subjects with civility, and to let them have xefrefinitents and other necessfaries for their Money.

From Cadis we are advised, that Sir Thomas Allen with the Feet under his Command, failed thence on the 21 of Mugust, where dividing his Fleet into three Squadrons, he ordered them to meet at their Rendezvous at Alecante, from whence he purpoled to cross over to Argier.

Himbourg, Oitob 4. Our L enters from Warfamybearing not a late Date, give us not any account of the King of Eolands Coronation, or what paffed at the folemnity or the enfueing great Affembly of the States of the Kingdom, but from the frontiers of the faid Kingdom they write, that Dorsfensko, General of one party of the Collacks had given a great defeat to the Tartars, with fome other Colfacks joyned with them between Corfon and Kiovia, and had purfued them toward Crim Tartary, which way they endeavoured to make good their Retreat, having with them Suchouitz, who was faid to be the General to the Rebel Colfacks.

From Copenhagen they write, that the Bilhop of Ofnabrug had made an overture or propolal of a Marriage between the young Prince, Son to the Prince Elector Palatine, of 18 years of uge, and a Prince's of Denmark.

They fatcher fay, that the King of Denmark returned home to Copenhagen the Asth of the last Months and had given Audience to the Heer le Mair, Refident from the States-General of the United Provinces.

From Hanouer that the Heer de Groot the Dutch Ambaffador having order from His Masters the States of the United Provinces on his return from Swelen to attend the Duke Jean Frederick, that the faid Duke was there arrived to receive from him fuch proposals as he was commanded to make to him.

Lett is of the 11. past from Stochholme informs us, that His Majefty the King of Swedland was invited by the continuance of the fair weather to purfue his recreations and huntings in the Country, but that feveral of the Senators were returned again to that City. And that His Excellency the Earl of Carlifle Ampassador Extraordinary from His Majefly of great Britaine intended within 15 days to embark himself on his seturn home, but to take Denmark in his way.
