**COAL ACT, 1938, AND COAL INDUSTRY
NATIONALISATION ACT, 1946.**

PURSUANT to Paragraph 6 (2) of the Second Schedule to the Coal Act, 1938, the National Coal Board hereby give notice that they propose to exercise the right to withdraw support vested in them by virtue of Paragraph 6 (1) of the said Schedule and the Coal Industry Nationalisation Act, 1946, so far as the said right applies in relation to certain parcels of land
