Upper North Dean Farm, Hughenden, Footpath Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 12th day of July, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running in a south-westerly direction from a point on the eastern boundary of field No. 723, Bucks O.S. Sheet No. XLII.1 (1925 Edition), and marked "A" on the map contained in the Order, for a distance of 420 feet or thereabouts, to a point on the south-western boundary of the said field No. 723 and marked "B" on the said map, to a line running in a southerly direction from the same point "A" for a distance of 260 feet or thereabouts, to a point marked "C" on the said map, then in a westerly direction for a distance of 200 feet or thereabouts, to point "D", and then in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 140 feet or thereabouts, to the same point "B" where it joins the existing right of way.

The Bullingdon R.D.C. New Manor Farm, Marston No. 1 Diversion Order, 1956.

Survey of Public Rights of Way.

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Cheshire County Council have prepared, in accordance with the provisions of Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, a draft map and statement showing the public rights of way which in their opinion subsisted, or were reasonably alleged to subsist, on the 1st June, 1956, in the Rural District of Chester in the Administrative County of Chester.

2. The following arrangements have been made to deposit the draft map and statement, or extracts therefrom, for public inspection on and from the 30th July, 1956:—

(b) A copy of the draft map and statement has also been deposited at the offices of the Chester Rural District Council, 16, White Friars, Chester, and may similarly be inspected during normal office hours.

(c) A copy of so much of the draft map and statement as relates to each parish in the Rural District has also been deposited with the Clerk of the Parish Council or in those cases where the Parish has no Council, the Chairman of the Parish Meeting, and may similarly be inspected at all reasonable times, by reference to the Clerk or Chairman.

Any objection or representation with reference to the draft map and statement may be sent in writing to the undersigned before the 1st December, 1956, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made and the right of way which it concerns.
