

The Letters from Paris which came in this Day do not confirm the News we had by the last Post from thence, of a Second Sally made by the Garrison of Verue. These Letters say, that the French King had given Orders, for the paying of 24 Millions of Livres out of the Exchequer, for the fitting out of his Fleet the next Summer. They write from the Moselle, that the French Forces on that side are in Motion, and that the Duke of Villieroy is expected at Thionville the 14th Instant, that the French are fortifying Sirk, and intend to make a Line from Luxembourg to Thiogville, and thence to Saar Louis. We hear that the Marshal de Villars is to command their Troops on the Maese the next Campaign. The Count de Goes Envoy from the Emperor, left this Place two days ago, in order to return to Vienna. Monsieur Bothmar Envoy from the Elector of Hanover to the States-General, is also gone to Hanover, but is shortly expected back again.

Falmouth, Jan. 8. Yesterday arrived here the Queen Pacquet-Boat, John Culverdine Commander, with one Mail from Lisbon, having been 10 days in her Passage. The Prince Pacquet-Boat, Zacharias Rogers' Commander, sailed hence the same day for Lisbon. This day came in here the Eagle Galley of Bristol, Shadrac Peale Master, from London, to laden Fish for Venice.

Dartmouth, Jan. 9. This day came in here Her Majesty's Ship the Worcester, Captain Thomas Butler Commander, who brought in three Prizes, which he took on the 5th, 6th and 7th Instant, one a Privateer, called the Cheat, the other two Merchant Mts., named the Hope and the St. Anthony of Padua, in Ballast.

Comics, Jan. 10. There are just now arrived in our Road the Thomas and Sarah of Topsism, John Stone Master, the Olive-Tree, John Tirrell Master, the Speedwell, Robert Tolles Master; and the William, William Jones Master, all three of Bidsford; and the William and Mary, Richard Dodge Master; being all laden with Stores from London, and bound for Plymouth. There came in at the same time the Richard and John of London, Robert Duck Master, bound for Carolina; the Black Galaxy of Milford, Christopher Wilson Master, for Dublin; and the Unity of Bristol, Francis Bond Master, laden with Pitch and Tar.

Tarmouth, Jan. 12. Yesterday came into our Road divers Coasters from the Northward, under Convoy of the Merlin Sloop; and this day came in several Ships laden with Corn for Portugal, under Convoy of Her Majesty's Ship the Swan, from Lym. This evening they all sailed again to the Southward.

St. James's, Jan. 13. This day Christopher Musgrave Esq; was (by Her Majesty's Command) Sworn One of the Clerks of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council in Ordinary, in the room of Sir John Nicholas, Kt. of the Bath, lately deceased.
