On the night of 7th/8th June, 1956, four time bombs were placed by E.O.K.A. terrorists in installations at Royal Air Force Station, Akrotiri. The first of these, which was placed in the bulk petrol installation of the contractors, Messrs. Howards, exploded at 23.30 hours and the second exploded in a derv bowser belonging to the same contractor at 00.50 hours. Shortly after this a patrol discovered a third bomb, consisting of a considerable quantity of dynamite wrapped round a detonator and time pencil, wedged against the entrance door of a hangar containing a number of Meteor and Venom aircraft undergoing repair. Flight Lieutenant Parker arrived and decided the bomb must be removed although he well knew that it was liable to explode at any minute. He approached the bomb and placed a slip-knot of string around the bundle, and then retired to a suitable distance before dragging it away from the hangar. His devotion to duty and disregard for his own safety merit the highest praise. His action almost certainly prevented considerable damage to Royal Air Force aircraft and property since the bomb in fact exploded less than five minutes later.
