

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

CITY OF PLYMOUTH.

*Plymouth Development Plan.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 11th day of September, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government approved with modifications the above Development Plan.

A certified copy of the Development Plan, as approved by the Minister, has been deposited at the office of the City Engineer and Surveyor, Westwell Street, Plymouth.

The copy of the Development Plan so deposited will be open for inspection, free of charge, by all persons interested between the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and from 2.45 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and from 9.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.

The Development Plan became operative as from the 21st day of September, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Development Plan desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Development Plan, he may, within six weeks from the 21st day of September, 1956, make application to the High Court.

## NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949.

BRADFIELD RURAL DISTRICT (LOWER BASILDON No. 1).  
*Extinguishment Order, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 13th day of September, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish as from 27th September, 1956, the public right of way running from a point on the Reading—Oxford Road (A.329) approximately 300 yards north west of the Crown Hotel eastwards for a distance of approximately 650 yards to Church Farm.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Council, 26, Bath Road, Reading, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. to 5 p.m.

The Order becomes operative as from the 22nd day of September, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

## NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949.

WYCOMBE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Brook Farm, Meadle, Footpath Diversion Order, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 6th day of September, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed (with modifications) the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running in a south-easterly direction from a point on the north-eastern boundary of field No. 324, O.S. Bucks Sheet No. XXXVII.3 (1921 Edition), and marked "A" on the map contained in the Order, for a distance of 105 feet or thereabouts, to a point on the western boundary of field No. 322, and marked "F" on the said map, and then continuing in approximately the same direction for a distance of 110 feet or thereabouts, to a point on the south-eastern boundary of field No. 322, where it crosses a footbridge over a stream, and marked "D" on the

said map, and then continuing in the same direction for a distance of 20 feet or thereabouts, to a point near the northern corner of field No. 313, where it divides into two, and marked "E" on the said map, to a line running in a southerly direction from the same point "A" for a distance of 235 feet or thereabouts, to a point on the south-eastern boundary of field No. 324, where it crosses the stream, and then continuing in the same direction for a distance of 35 feet or thereabouts, to a point on the north-western part of field No. 313, where it joins an existing right of way, and marked "C" on the said map.

The existing right of way will be extinguished on the 30th day of November, 1956, and as from that date the path will be closed to the use of the public.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, 17, High Street, High Wycombe, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays and between 9 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 21st day of September, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of the publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

*County Council of Durham (Footpath over Morton House Level Crossing, Fence Houses) Extinguishment Order, 1956.*
