Meizodfol z. Xellenday the Linksmarrived here on horseback King Gafimir from Poland, attended by the Sieur de Vantéles à Geneleman in Ordinary of the Houshold-to His most Christian Majesty, and the Deputies which were fent from the City to compliment him upon his arrival on the borders of our Territories; upon his entry, His Majelties Lieu. Governous assended him, and as a mark of highest Hodout, presented him with the Keys of the City, then the Stientis made their Compliments which were pro-nounced by its Sieur de Guery ind Pelacipal of them in the name of the reft. In the huster time all the Arrillery and Great Gains about the Town, budly proclaimed his welcome : In the door of the Great Church to which he were under a Conopy of State which was born over hims he was met by the Archbilhop d'Ambrita Bilhop of this place, who presented him with a Cross and an Eloquent Speech; which endeds he wook his feat in the Church where Te Deum was lung with excellent Mulick; after this he took Coach and was conducted with much Cetemony to the Palace provided for his Reteption and Britertainment, and was that Evening dive tiled with leveral Fireworks

This day the Deputies from the Parliament attended him with their Compliments, as did also the Magistrates and the several Companies of the Citizens.

Hambourgh, Octob. 4. From Ratisbonne we are confirmed in the report that the States have fully confented to the railing of Thirty thousand men to be a standing force to be in readinels upon all occasions for the desence of the Empire, by whomsoever it shall be attacked, and have fent the Resolve made upon that point to the Emperour; and tis believed, speedy Orders will be issued out to all the parts of the Empire concerned therein to raise their proportion.

There was some time since presented to the Diet a Memorial from the Republick of Venice, with much earnestnels foliciting for a powerful and general fuctor to be fent from the united body of the whole Empire, which might enable them to take the Field, and by open force oblige the Grand Visier to quit the Siege of the much distressed Town of Gandia, but this being pur upon debates met with many difficulties; some Princes of the Empire having already contributed what they were able to their affiftance and others excusing themselves upon their disability; insomuch as after a long confideration, they were constrained to leave the succor of that Republick to the discretion of the several Princes and States, without giving any Rule for their proportions.

The Duke of Lorrain had by his Planipotentiary offered lo far to comply with the pretentions of the Count de Nasaut as to make restitution of the Lordship of Herbitzheim, and a Molety of the County of Saerwerden, but this is not yet accepted of the Count jeeming not willing to abate any thing of what the Duke can be obliged to by the in-

strument of the peace of Munster,

Letters, but of no very late date from Warfam inform us, that the Coronation of the lately Elected King was intended to be performed with much magnificency, the foreign Ambassayors as well as the Nobility being at extraordinary expences in furnishing out their Trains and Liverics to appear with as much splendor as they were able at that

They farther fay, that Prince Michael Radgevel had made His Majesty a Present of a very rich Coach, and had some design of p oposing to him a Ma ringe with the Princels d' Offrog his Ladys Daughter, and Nerce to the Grand Ma shal, to which the greatest part of the Nobility seemed much inclinable, but 'twas believed would be diverted from his purpose, upon the great inclination be finds in His Majesty to puriue the proposal which has been already fo much advanced, of a Marriage with the Princels of Austria, His Majesty having been observed to Treat the persons employ'd from Vienna upon that affair with extraotdinary kindnels, and to put a great esteem upon her Picture, which was sengo him in a Frame sichly set about with Diamonds.

fainfied

The Emperor has lately sent Order to Chemnitz, a Town upon the Mountains in Hungary, to eppose such of the Reformed Protestant Religion as are got together in an unlawfull manner to possess themselves of some Churches made ule of by the Roman Catholicks, which they pretend

were formerly unduly taken from them.

Bourges, Octob. 7. The 5th instant arrived here the Corps of the lately deceased Cardinal and Duke de Vendofme, which was carried on a Chariot covered with black Velvet, Emb oidered with a Silver Cross and the said Cardinals Coat of Arms; before the Chariot rod two Almoners, one of them bearing his Cardinals Hat, the other his Cap, after it marched the Captain of his Guards at the head of his Troop, followed by all the Officers of the Cardinals Houshold and a great Train of Coaches, the Corps was disposed of in the body of the Church of St Stephens, with as much State as the little notice the Cannons had of his arrival could allow them.

Yetterday the several Orders of the Religious and other Ecclesiasticks, meeting at the said Church, conducted the Body to the Gate of the City, where it was received by the Abbot of Saint Sulpitius with the Religious, with many Torches, who attended the body out of the Subutbs, where it was received again by the Convoy, who continued their intended journey towards Vendosme, the place designed

for its Enterrement.

Paris, Odob. 22. The Letters by which the Duke de Navailles informed His Majesty of his arrival at Thoulens gives him also advice, that the same day put into the same Port of Thoulon a thip; the Master whereof had been long known to the Dake, who informed him, that the Town of Candiz came to a Capitulation with the Turks the 2 of September, viz. Five days after the departure of the Auxiliary forces, and had agreed upon A ricles of furrender, affirming that he law 20 Turkish Officers, all of them feemingly persons of good quality whom the Visier had sent as Hostages for the security of the Articles agreed on.

On Saturday last the King arrived at Verfailles, and the next night came to St Germains; Some disputes have been about the manner of Treating the King of Poland, and whither the King should give him the Right hand he being an Elective King, but this was at last agreed in the

Affirmative.

The States of Bretagne have upon the folicitation of the Dake de Chaulnes, granted to the King the fumme of two

Millions and two hundred thouland Liures.

Edenbourg, Oftob. 9. This night arrived at the Earl of Toadales house at Yester about 14 miles distant from this place his G ace the Earl of Lauderdale, His Majesties High Commissioner for the Parliament of Scotland, and on Munday in the Evening is expected here: he has through all all his journey in all parts been honourably received and entertained, and particularly at Stamford was met by the Lord Bishop of Durham, who obligingly invited him to make use of his Castle of Durham for his Lodging, and accordingly took Order for his entertainment, where the Lord Commissioner lodged one night; the Town of Newcaftle made likewise Provision for his Graces entertainment, but he made no stop in that place. At Wooller the Lord Widrington with divers persons of quality attented his Grace and waited on him to the borders of Scotland, where he was met by divers of the Nobility and Gentry of Scotland, particularly by the Barl of Rombourg at the head of a numerous Train of the Gentry of Teviotda'e, and the Batl of Hume with another of the Merce, belides divers persons of the most considerable Quality from the Three Lothians the Western Shires, and divers other places of the Kingdom, where were also attending him in good Order the Two Militia Troops and two Regiments of the Counties of Roxbourg and Selkirk: ye-Bernight his Grace lodged at the Friors near Kelfo, the body which artended him thither being computed to be above 2000 Horse, an universal joy appearing in all people upon his arrival.
