Twin, Jan. 8. N. S. Our Advices from Verue fay, The Enemy had been hard at work to repair the Da-mage done to their Trenches and Batteries in the Salley which the Besieged made on the 26th past; and that several of their Batteries not being in a Condition to fire during all this time, it had given the Garison an Opportunity of repairing their Works. In the mean time, the Duke of Vendosme, having sent for more Cannon from the Milaneze, had raised a new Battery of 8 pieces upon the Lodgment he lately made on the Covered-way; but our Men had forung a Mine under that Battery, and buried two of his Cannon. The Weather has lately been fair, and excessive cold; but the Snow began anew to fall yesterday, which greatly accommodes the Besiegers.

Vienna, Jan. 14. The Emperor being perfectly reacovered of his late Indisposition, appears in publick, and was present this morning in his Council; where Count Wratislaw, who lately Resided as his Envoy Extraordinary in England, was Sworn into the Place of Chief Justice of Bohemia. Hambourg, Jan. 23. N. S. They write from Leipsig, That the King of Poland left that Place the 20th, in order to return to Dresden. Our Advices from Poland fay, That the new Elected King Stanislaus was gone to Dantzick to confer with the Cardinal Primate; That a Body of 4000 Muscovites was come to Wilda, and that 30000 more, Commanded by Prince Czeremet, were marching thither from Pultock; their Defign being, as was thought, to make an Irruption into Courland, and force the Swedes to retire out of that Durchy; who, on the other hand, were drawing together a Body of Troops under Gene-

Hague, Jan. 27. N. S. The Deputies of the Admi-

ralty are yet here, confering daily with those of the States General, upon our Naval Preparations for the next Summer, which are ordered to be made with all possible Expedition, and several Ships of 80 and 90 Guns are already fitting out at Amsterdam. The States of the Province of Utrecht are to affemble this Week to Confult upon several Matters agreed upon by the States General, to which the Confent of the particular Provinces is requifice: Those of the Province of Holland inrend to meet for the, same purpose the Week following. Some Persons, who are lately arrived here from Bruffels, tay, That at the time of their departure from thence, it was reported. That upon some Dispute between the French and Spanish Forces in Garnion at Luxembourg, the Quarrel was carried on so far, that the latter, with the Assistance of the Burghers, had forced the French to march out of the Town; but we know not yet what Credit to give to this Advice. They write from France, That the Sieges of Verue and Gibraltar were still carried on with great Obstinacy, notwith flanding the many Disappointments which the French have hitherto met with in both these Undertakings, and the Rigour of the Season, which alone destroys great numbers of their Men.
