Hague, Jan. 27. N. S. The Deputies of the Admiralty are yet here, conferring daily with those of the States General; upon our Naval Preparations for the next Summer, which are ordered to be made with all possible Expedition, and several Ships of 80 and 90 Guns are already fitting out at Amsterdam. The States of the Province of Utrecht are to assemble this Week to Consult upon several Matters agreed upon by the States General, to which the Consent of the particular Provinces is requisite: Those of the Province of Holland intend to meet for the same purpose the Week following. Some Persons, who are lately arrived here from Brussels, say, That at the time of their departure from thence, it was reported, That upon some Dispute between the French and Spanish Forces in Garrison at Luxembourg, the Quarrel was carried on so far, that the latter, with the Assistance of the Burghers, had forced the French to march out of the Town; but we know not yet what Credit to give to this Advice. They write from France, That the Sieges of Vervins and Gibraltar were still carried on with great Obstinate, notwithstanding the many Disappointments which the French have hitherto met with in both these Undertakings, and the Rigour of the Season, which drives off great numbers of their Men.

Falmouth, Jan. 15. Yesterday put in here the Blue-Pidgeon, Giles Jacobson Master; the Merklesee, Jacob Plesk Master; and the Eagle, Dingerman Smill Master, from Zuricke, bound for Waterford and Cork. This day came in the Charles the Third, a Privateer of Flushing, and brought in with him a Prize, which he took on the 13th instant, called the Rose-and-Crown, of Ostend, laden with Wine, Brandy, and Salt, of 18 Guns.

Plymouth, Jan. 16. Yesterday came in here the Sarah Dogger of Dartmouth, Elias Bussey Master, from Oporto, laden with Wine, and bound for London; and the Hopswell, of and from Fowey, bound for Virginia. The same day sailed hence the St. Peter of Dantzick, homeward bound, and laden with Salt.

Plymouth, Jan. 25. This day came into our Roads Her Majesty's Ships the Solebay and Sorling from the Southward, to Convoy a Fleet of Corn Ships bound from hence to Holland; with them came also several Coasters and light Vessels.
