On 9th February, 1956, a defect occurred in the auxiliary feed pump in the stokehold of H.M.E.A.S. ROSALIND and the stokehold became filled with steam blowing at 190 lbs. pressure. Petty Officer Orowe volunteered to climb over the top of the boiler to reach the check valve in order to shut off the steam, after the ship's engineer had been overcome by the heat while attempting to do so. In view of the terrific heat on top to do so. In view of the terrific heat on top of the boiler and the danger of being overcome before reaching the top, this required courage and determination of a high order. After crawling along the top of the boiler, relying upon his knowledge of the situation of the valve, Petty Officer Orowe climbed down on to a grating in a very confined space full of hot steam and shut the valve. The initiative, courage and devotion to duty of Petty Officer Orowe prevented a serious explosion.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE INLAND REVENUE.

Candidates must be at least 25 and under 34 years of age on 1st October, 1956. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st October, 1956.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October 1946 or who are widows or divorced on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the peniod in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years. years.

Nationality.

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the

Irish Republic, or

British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

All candidates must

(1) have passed the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, or of

the Chartered Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute, or of the Land Agents' Society, or hold a University Degree (e.g. B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge or B.Sc. (Estate Management) London), which gives exemption from the examination of any one of these bodies;

(2) hold Corporate Membership of one of these bodies

bodies.

Candidates who satisfy (1) but not (2) will be admitted to the competition but, if successful, will not have their appointments confirmed unless they obtain Corporate Membership of one of the three bodies within their probation period.

All candidates must, on the closing date for the receipt of applications, have had at least four years' professional experience before or after qualifying

(a) the office of a F.R.I.C.S., F.A.I., F.L.A.S., or any Government or municipal service; or

(b) the office of any other surveyor, estate agent or land agent which in the opinion of the Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate experience.

For posts in Scotland it is desirable that the qualifying examination passed should have been based on a Scotlish Syllabus and that the professional experience should have been gained in Scotland. Scotland.

For posts involving the valuation of minerals, four years' mining experience will be required in place of the professional experience specified above; candidates should have some knowledge of the problems arising from subsidence in mining areas as well as of the valuation of minerals.

For these posts possession of a First Class Certi-For these posts possession of a First Class Certificate of Competency (Mine Managers) or Corporate Membership of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors accompanied by the passing of the final examination of this body in the Mining sub-division will be accepted as professional qualifications. Candidates who have passed this examination but are not Corporate Members will be admitted but, if successful, will not have their appointments conif successful, will not have their appointments con-firmed unless they obtain Corporate Membership of this body during their probation period.

Exceptionally, if a successful candidate is prevented by circumstances outside his control from obtaining Corporate Membership within his probation period, the appointment may be confirmed, with the concurrence of the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, provided that there is satisfactory evidence that the qualification is likely to be obtained within a reasonable time.

Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their heatlh and character.

6. Competition.

The candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidates who appear to them to be most suitable. The Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past and from candidates' past employers, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview. The decision of the Commissioners will be final. will be final.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons who have been trained as teachers, elsewhere than in England and Wales, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland), has been notified to the Commissioners.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

RECRUITMENT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. There will be two methods of entry: Method I 1. There will be two methods of entry: Method I and Method II. Regulation 2 relates to Method II, and Regulations 3 and 4 to Method II; the remaining Regulations relate to both Methods. No candidate may compete more than twice, but if he competes under both Method I and Method II in the same year this will be treated as a single attempt.

2. Examination

(i) The examination consists of the following:—
(A) A written examination in
(a) three compulsory subjects, namely, Essay, English, and Present Day, to each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted;

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 700 marks (making 1,000 marks in all for the written examination). (B) Interview, comprising

(B) Interview, comprising

(a) a preliminary interview by one or more interviewers, who will supply reports for the information of the Final Interview Board;

(b) an interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may at their discretion require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Interview Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

METHOD II

3. Examination

(A) 'A written examination comprising two papers in English, two General Papers, and a test of General Intelligence, to each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted (making 500 marks in all) marks in all).

(B) A series of tests and interviews at the Civil Service Selection Board.

(C) An interview before the Final Selection Board.

Board.

(ii) Candidates who in the written examination under (i) (A) reach a certain standard (to be determined by the Commissioners) will be invited to the Civil Service Selection Board. Of those who fail by a narrow margin to reach this mark, the Commissioners may select a further number for the Civil Service Selection Board, after considering their records

(iii) The Commissioners will subsequently select in the light of the candidates' performances at the Civil Service Selection Board and of their records those who will be admitted to interview by the Final Selection Board.

(iv) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board out of a maximum of 300. This will take into account the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may at their disretion require a candidate to oftend may at their discretion require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Selection Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

(v) The Commissioners may exempt from the written examination under (i) (A) a candidate who has previously obtained good marks for it, or for the compulsory papers in the Method I examination, and in the same competition has also been awarded a mark of more than 200 by the Final Board. The previous competition must have been a recent open competition for the Administrative Class or the Senior Branch of the Foreign Service.

(vi) The Commissioners may at their discretion.

(vi) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from (i) (B) anyone who has appeared at the Civil Service Selection Board before, provided he applies for such exemption on his application form.

4. Education

4. Education
(i) Candidates must either (a) have obtained at least second class honours in a full honours degree examination at a recognised university, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a full honours degree at a recognised university. In the latter case, they will not be appointed (if declared successful) unless they produce evidence, not later than 1st September of the year in which they compete, that they have obtained at ileast second class honours in their degree examination.

(ii) A candidate who has served or is serving on

(ii) A candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may be admitted to compete, notwithstanding that he fails to satisfy the requirements of sub-paragraph (i), if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete, and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service authority, as warranting consideration for appointment to the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

METHODS I AND II.

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August, 1957. But a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the 1st August, 1957.

Both men and women are eligible, but women will not ordinarily be appointed to posts in the Ministry of Defence, Admiralty, War Office, or Air Ministry.

7. Nationality.

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Country or matter.

8. Health and Character.

9. Vacancies.

The number of vacancies to be filled from the competition as a whole, and the number to be filled by Method I and Method II respectively, will be determined by the Commissioners.

10. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers elsewhere than in England and Wales, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

11. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.
