

Horton and the parish of Smeeth shall continue in all respects distinct.

"3. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Oliver William Thompson Evans, if he is then incumbent of the said benefices of Brabourne with Monks Horton and Smeeth, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Parsonage house.*

"(a) After the union has taken effect and upon the provision at Smeeth of a house approved by us as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, such house as aforesaid shall be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(b) Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Brabourne with Monks Horton, if at that date it so belongs, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"(c) So much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as we, after consultation with the Archbishop for the time being of the said diocese, shall deem sufficient shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing a house of residence at Smeeth as aforesaid and the balance (if any) of the said proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Canterbury established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Foleshill, Wyken and Walsgrave-on-Sowe in the diocese of Coventry.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cuthbert, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and

delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Chad, Woodend.'

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Coventry and in the rural deanery of Coventry.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts of the parishes of Foleshill, Wyken and Walsgrave-on-Sowe which are bounded on the north by the parish of Saint Thomas, Longford, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary between the parishes of Saint Thomas, Longford, and Foleshill in the middle of the bridge which carries Alderman's Green Road across the River Sowe and proceeding thence downstream along the middle of the said river to a point in the middle of Henley Road and continuing thence generally southeastwards along the middle of the said road to a point in the middle of the unnamed brook or stream running along the western boundary of close number 4736 and proceeding thence upstream thereby crossing close number 3335 and continuing thence first northeastwards and then generally northwards along the middle of the said stream to a point opposite the northern boundary of close number 0919 and continuing thence westwards to and then generally westwards along the said boundary and then generally northwards along the eastern and northeastern boundaries of close number 0031 and the eastern boundary of close number 9741 and then northwestwards along the northeastern boundaries of closes numbered 9741, 9142 and 8645 and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Deedmore Road and thence northeastwards along the middle of the said road to a point opposite the middle of the footpath from Deedmore Road to Alderman's Green Road and thence first northwestwards and then northwards along the middle of the said footpath to its junction with the boundary between the parishes of Walsgrave-on-Sowe and Saint Thomas, Longford."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Coventry.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Winterslow, Winterbourne Gunner, and Winterbourne Dauntsey, all in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:
