The Gipping R.D.C. (Parish of Stonham Aspal  
No. 1) Diversion Order, 1956.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 30th day of November, 1956, and is about to be submitted to the Ministry of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.
