PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S most Excellent Majesty in Council,

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of December, 1956 (N.P. 5602/56) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates 21st March, 1924, 24th February, 1948, 29th September, 1949, 30th June, 1955, and 16th May, 1956, sanction was given, inter alia, to certain scales of gratuities for long service, or on invaliding for non-attributable causes, to Locally Entered Petty Officers and Men. of Your Majesty's Naval Forces:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that in so far as they affect West African, St. Helenian, Bantu, Somali, Ceylonese and Goan Petty Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval Forces, these scales of gratuities should be revised:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to award, with effect from 2nd October, 1956, service gratuity to Locally Entered West African, St. Helenian, Bantu, Somali, Ceylonese and Goan Petty Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval Forces at the rates and subject to the conditions specified in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

" SCHEDULE.

"The provisions of this Schedule apply to all West African, St. Helenian, Bantu, Somali, Ceylonese and Goan ratings of the Royal Navy who are discharged from the Naval Service after the 1st October, 1956.

"2. Subject to the following provisions such a R.N. Locally Entered Rating who has twelve or more years' reckonable service preceding his discharge may be granted a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

"After twelve years such service ... 35 0 0
For each complete year of such service in excess of twelve years an increase of 8 15 0

"A rating who is invalided and who has six or more years' reckonable service prior to his discharge may be granted a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

"For each complete year of such service in excess of five years and up to ten years 3 10 0

For each complete year of such service in excess of ten years 8 15 0

"3. In addition to the service element, assessed in accordance with Clause 2, a rating who is

"(a) discharged otherwise than for misconduct or for inefficiency due to causes within his own control; if he has completed at least 30 years' reckonable service; or

"(b) discharged on reduction of establishment with not less than 22 years' reckonable service; or

"(c) invalided whilst serving on a non-continuous service engagement after the completion of 12 years' reckonable service.

may be awarded rank additions, based on the whole of his reckonable service as follows:—

#For each complete year of service as—

Leading Rating 2 10 0

Petty Officer 5 0 0

Chief Petty Officer 7 10 0

"4. Reckonable service will be as for Naval Ratings generally. In calculating reckonable service all satisfactory periods of regular service may be aggregated, except that service preceding a five-year interval in service will not be reckonable service unless specially so allowed by the Admiralty. No period in respect of which a gratuity has already been paid may be allowed to reckon unless such gratuity is repaid either in cash or by deductions from pay.

"5. If a rating is discharged for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, or for misconduct, or with disgrace or ignominy, the grant of a service gratuity, or its amount, will be discretionary.

"6. A service gratuity will not be payable on discharge for the purposes of giving further full pay service in the Armed Forces,

"7. If a rating dies whilst serving no gratuity will be payable."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of November, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Derby, (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Sudbury, Somersal, Boylestone and Scropton in the diocese of Derby by separating therefrom the benefice of Boylestone and the benefice of Scropton. of Scropton.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 1st day of April, 1953 (hereinafter called 'the Order of 1953') and published in the London Gazette on the 3rd day of the same month, the benefice of Sudbury, the benefice of Somersal Herbert, the benefice of Boylestone and the benefice of Scropton were united into one benefice with cure of souls, but the parishes of the said benefices continued in all respects distinct;

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Derby has forwarded to us provisional proposals pursuant to the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the benefice of Boylestone and the benefice of Scropton should be separted from the united benefice of Sudbury, Somersal, Boylestone and Scropton (hereinafter called 'the said united benefice'), and should be held by one incumbent in plurality;

"And whereas effect and

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the separation of the benefice of Boylestone and of the benefice of Scropton from the said united benefice by a Scheme prepared by us and affirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and in so far as they relate to the said plurality by a subsequent order made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

"Now, therefore, we do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:

"1. With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Edward Benjamin Bull, now incumbent of the said united benefice, upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette— And whereas effect can be given to the said pro-

(a) the benefice of Boylestone and the benefice of Scropton shall be separated from the said united benefice, and the parishes of Boylestone and Scrop-

benefice, and the parishes of Boylestone and Scropton shall be assigned respectively to the benefices of Boylestone and Scropton so separated;

"(b) the remainder of the said united benefice shall be known as 'The Benefice of Sudbury and Somersal Herbert' and the said Reverend Edward Benjamin Bull shall remain the incumbent thereof.

"2. Upon the separation taking effect—

"(a) the glebe house at Scropton belonging to the said united benefice and known as 'Kelmscott' shall become and be the parsonage house of the benefice of Scropton;

"(b) the parsonage house of the said united benefice shall remain the parsonage house of the benefice of Sudbury and Somersal Herbert.

"3. Upon the separation taking effect—

"(a) the patrons (or their successors in title) of the said united benefice who immediately prior

the said united benefice who immediately prior to the union under the Order of 1953 were respectively patrons of the former benefices of Boylestone and Scropton shall respectively be the patrons of the separated benefices of Boylestone and

of the separated benefices of Boylestone and Scropton; "(b) the right of presentation to the benefice of Sudbury and Somersal Herbert shall be exercised alternately by the patrons (or their successors in title) who immediately prior to the union under the Order of 1953 were patrons of the former benefices of Sudbury and Somersal Herbert, the patron of the former benefice of Somersal Herbert having the first turn of presentation after the having the first turn of presentation after the separation.

"4. Upon the separation taking effect Clause 4 of the Order of 1953 (which relates to the employment of a curate or other clerical or lay assistance by the incumbent of the said united benefice and to the appropriation of a fund to meet the cost of providing such assistance) shall be wholly rescinded.

"5. Upon the separation taking effect—
"(a) there shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Scropton the whole of the endowments benefice of Scropton the whole of the endowments and property which belonged to the former benefice of Scropton immediately prior to the union under the Order of 1953 with the exception of such proportion thereof as we, the said Church Commissioners, shall have appropriated or shall hereafter appropriate towards the cost of the purchase of the glebe house known as 'Kelmscott' hereinbefore of the glebe house known as 'Kelmscott' hereinbefore of designated the parsonage house of the benefice of

designated the parsonage house of the benefice of Scropton; "(b) there shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Boylestone the whole of the endowments and property which belonged to the former benefice of Boylestone immediately prior to the union under the Order of 1953; "(c) all other the endowments and property of the said united benefice shall remain as endowments and property of the benefice of Sudbury and Somersal Herbert."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in witness whereof "We, George, Bishop of Chichester (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now hambly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting (1) alterations in the boundaries of the parishes of Milland, Iping, Trotton, Rogate, Stedham and Terwick, and (2) the unions of (i) the benefice and parish of Trotton and a part of the benefice and parish of Iping, (ii) the benefice and parish of Iping, and (iii) the benefice and parish of Lynch and the remaining part of the benefice and parish of Iping, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Chichester.

"SCHEME.

"1. Alteration of boundaries.

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette, and with the consents (which have been given to us in writing), insofar as each such consent is required, of the Reverend William Thomas Rees, being the incumbent of the benefice of Milland, of the Reverend Francis Vere Hodge, being the incumbent of the benefice of Iping, of the Reverend Roland Braby, being the incumbent of the benefice of Trotton, of the Reverend Lendon Bell, being the incumbent of the benefices of Rogate and Terwick, and of the Reverend Daniel Holme Pilkington, being the incumbent of the benefice of Stedham, the boundaries of the parishes of Milland, Iping, Trotton, Rogate, Stedham and Terwick shall be altered in the manner described in the First Schedule hereto and delineated on map A annexed "Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty Schedule hereto and delineated on map A annexed to this Scheme.

- "2. Union of the benefice and parish of Trotton and part of the benefice and parish of Iping.
- "(1) Union of benefices and parishes. The benefice and parish of Trotton and all that part of the benefice and parish of Iping which is described in Part 1 of the Second Schedule hereto and delineated or map B annexed hereto shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Trotton with Chithurst' and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

 "(2) Taking effect of union. With the consent (given as aforesaid) of the Reverend Francis Vere Hodge and of the Reverend Roland Braby, upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Roland Braby, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Trotton, shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

 "(2) Project Character Linear the union taking effect
- "(3) Parish Church. Upon the union taking effect the parish church of the parish of Trotton shall be the parish church of the united parish.
- "(4) Parsonage house. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Trotton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the union taking
- "(5) Patronage. After the union has taken effect the patronage of the united benefice shall be exercised solely by the patrons of the benefice of Trotton.
- "3. Union of the benefice and parish of Stedham and a further part of the benefice and parish of Iping.
- "(1) Union of benefices and parishes. The benefice and parish of Stedham and all that part of the benefice and parish of Iping (containing the parish church) which is described in Part 2 of the said Second Schedule and delineated on map B shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stedham with Iping' and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.
- "(2) Taking effect of union. (a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the benefices of Iping and Lynch shall both be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect; (b) if vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect; (b) if upon that day one only of the said benefices of lping and Lynch shall be vacant the union shall take effect immediately upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two benefices; (c) if upon that day neither of the said two benefices of Iping and Lynch shall be vacant the union shall take effect immediately upon the first avoidance of that one of the two benefices which shall last be avoided after that date; (d) in any of the said events the first incumbent of the united benefice shall with his consent (given as aforesaid) be the Reverend Daniel Holme Pilkington, now incumbent of the benefice of Stedham, if he is at the relevant date incumbent of that benefice or if he is not then incumbent of that benefice shall be his successor (if any) at that date therein.
- "(3) Parish church. Upon the union taking effect the parish church of the parish of Stedham shall be the parish church of the united parish.
- "(4) Registers. Upon the union taking effect, the marriage registers current at the parish church of the parish of Iping shall be dealt with in accordance with section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said oburch shall be transferred to the parish church of the united parish. church of the united parish.
- "(5) Parsonage house. Without prejudice to the exercise, before the date when the union takes effect, of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stedham shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united
- "(6) Patronage. After the union has taken effect, in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the patron of the benefice of Stedham shall have the first and third turns and the patron of the benefice of Iping shall have the second turn.

- "4. Union of the benefice and parish of Lynch and the remaining part of the benefice and parish
- "(1) Union of benefices and parishes. (a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette both of the said benefices shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect, (b) if upon that day one only of the said benefices shall be vacant the union shall take effect immediately upon the next avoidance of the other, (c) if upon that day neither of the said benefices shall be vacant the union shall take effect immediately upon the first avoidance of that one of the two benefices which shall last be avoided after that date.

- "(3) Parish church. Upon the union taking effect the parish church of the parish of Lynch shall be the parish church of the united parish.
- "(4) Parsonage house. Without prejudice to the exercise, before the date when the union takes effect, of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Iping shall, if at that date it so belongs, become and be the residence house of the incumbent of the united benefice and the marsonage house at present belongs. benefice and the parsonage house at present belong-ing to the benefice of Lynch shall, if at that date it so belongs, become a glebe house belonging to the united benefice.
- "(5) Patronage. After the union has taken effect the patronage of the united benefice shall be exercised solely by the patron of the benefice of Lvnch.
- "5. Distribution of endowments.
- "(1) Upon the taking effect of the union recom-mended and proposed in clause 2 of this scheme a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £100 and forming part of a larger capital sum held by us for the benefice of Iping shall be annexed to the united benefice of Trotton with Chithurst.

 "(2) Upon the taking effect of the union recommended and proposed in clause 4 of this Scheme, a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £200 and being a further part of the larger capital sum held by us for the benefice of Iping shall be annexed to the united benefice of Lynch with Iping Marsh; provided that the liability for the repayment to us of the principal sum of £3,600, together with interest, which by deed dated the 1st day of April, 1951, is charged on the endowments and emoluments of the benefice of Iping shall, if still subsisting at the date when the said union takes effect, attach solely to the endowments and emoluments of the said united benefice of Lynch with Iping Marsh.

"FIRST SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory (coloured pink on map A) to be annexed to the parish of Milland:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Iping which dies to the north of the southern boundaries of closes numbered 20, 22, 23, 24 and 25.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Trotton which lies to the north of the middle of the

Hammer Stream.

"(c) All that part of the parish of Rogate which lies to the north of the middle of the road leading to Fernhurst from the Jolly Drover inn on the main road from London to Portsmouth.

"2. The territory (coloured green on map A) to be annexed to the parish of dping:—

"(a) All those three detached parts of the parish of Stedham situate in the civil parishes of Iping and Chithurst.

"(b) All that detached part of the parish of Terwick situate in the civil parish of Chithurst.

"(c) All those two detached parts of the parish

of Trotton situate in the civil parish of Chithurst.

of Trotton situate in the civil parish of Chithurst.

"(a) All that part (excluding the detached parts) of the parish of Trotton which lies (a) to the east of the middle of Hog Lane and to the south of the stream which flows into the southwestern end of Cook's Pond, and (b) to the south of the middle of the Hammer Stream and to the north of a continuous imaginary line along the middle of the stream which flows into the southwestern end of Cook's Pond, the western boundary of close numbered 219 and the middle of the road running between Common Wood and Lower Common Wood.

"3. The territory (coloured brown on map A) to be annexed to the parish of Trotton:—

"All that part of the parish of Terwick which lies to the southeast of the northern and western boundaries of close numbered 105 and the western boundary of close numbered 98 and a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of the River Rother.

"SECOND SCHEDULE.

"1. Part of the parish of Iping (coloured green on map B) to be united to the parish of Trotton

comprising:

"(a) All that part (containing the church of Chithurst) of the parish of Iping comprising that part of the civil parish of Chithurst which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Trotton from the parish of Iping at the junction of Green Lane and Gatehouse Lane and continuing there southeastwards along the middle of Green Lane and Gatehouse Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the southern boundary of close numbered 171 and continuing thence to and along the southern boundary of that close and along the southern and eastern boundaries of close numbered 170 to and thence along the middle of Green Lane to the point where it meets Chithurst Lane and continuing thence due eastwards to a point in the middle of the Hammer Stream (thereby crossing closes numbered 188 and 187) and continuing thence generally southeastwards along the middle of that stream to the boundary of the civil parish of Chithurst, and of Chithurst, and

"(b) All that further part of the parish of Iping which lies to the west of a continuous imaginary line along the middle of Elstead Road and the moad which passes the house known as 'Bunker's Lodge' and leads to Trotton Common.

"2. Part of the parish of Iping (coloured pink on map B) to be united to the parish of Stedham comprising:

All that part of the parish of Iping (containing the parish church) which is not otherwise united or transferred by any provision of this Scheme and which lies to the east and south of a continuous imaginary line following the boundary of the civil parish of Chithurst from where it leaves the Hammer Stream near New Bridge to the northwest corner of close numbered 261, part of the northern boundary of that close, the western and northern boundaries of close numbered 242, want of the southeastern boundaries of close numbered 242, part of the southeastern boundaries of close numbered 242, part of the southeastern boundaries of closes numbered 240 and 238, the middle of the track or footpath leading from Moorhouse Farm eastwards across closes numbered 245 and 232, the middle of Iping Lane and Cox's Lane and the footpath which continues eastwards from Cox's Lane across close numbered 214."
