WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of December, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Horden, Easington, Easington Colliery and Shotton and (2) constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Horden, Easington and Easington Colliery in the diocese of Durham

- "Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satiswhereas we, the Church Commissioners, are saus-fied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Horden, Easington, Easington Colliery and Shotton should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:
- "And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:
- "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—
 - "1. As from the day of the date of the publica-Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the boundaries of the said parishes of Horden, Easington, Easington Colliery and Shotton shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and delineated on the map hereto
 - "2. (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes
 - "(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.
 - "(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Cuthbert. Peterlee'.
 - "(d) The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Durham and in the rural deanery of Easington.

- "(b) All that part (coloured purple on the map hereto annexed) of the parish of Easington which is bounded on the east by the parish of Easington Colliery and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the boundary which divides the parish of Easington from the parish of Easington Colliery where the said boundary is crossed by the boundary of the Designated Area of Peterlee New Town and continuing thence first southwestwards, then southeastwards, then southwestwards, then northwestwards, then northwestwards, then northwards along the boundary of the said Designated Area to the point where the last mentioned boundary meets the southern side of Thorpe Road and continuing thence first in a last mentioned boundary meets the southern side of Thorpe Road and continuing thence first in a straight line northwards to, then eastwards along the middle of Thorpe Road to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the western boundary of close numbered 498 (on the map) and continuing thence northeastwards to said along the said wall or fence to its end and to and along the said wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Easington from the parish of Easington Colliery in the middle of the road leading from Warren House to Horden Hall.
