

along the middle of Wapping Burn to its junction with Gore Burn and continuing thence first southwards to, then generally southwards along, the middle of Gore Burn to its junction with Castle Eden Burn and continuing thence in a straight line southwards to the boundary which divides the parish of Easington from the parish of Castle Eden in the middle of Castle Eden Burn."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of December, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Pontefract; All Saints, Pontefract; and Saint Michael, Carleton; all in the diocese of Wakefield.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Roger, Bishop of Wakefield, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Pontefract; All Saints, Pontefract; and Saint Michael, Carleton; shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Pontefract:—

"(a) All that part (excluding the area described in paragraph 2 of this Scheme) of the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, upon the west and the northwest by the parish of Pontefract and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Pontefract from the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, in the middle of Southgate opposite to the middle of the northwestern end of Slutwell Lane and proceeding thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned lane and in continuation thereof along the middle of Grove Road to a point opposite to the middle of the southwestern end of the footpath leading from the last mentioned road to Harewood Avenue and continuing thence first northeastwards to and then northeastwards and southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises known as 43 and 41 Harewood Avenue and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the house

known as 43 Harewood Avenue to its end and continuing thence in the same straight line to the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close number 4950 (thereby crossing Harewood Avenue) and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming generally the southern boundary of Willow Park Junior School to its end at a point on the northwestern side of Chequerfield Lane opposite to the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the grounds attached to Chequerfield Hospital and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end (thereby crossing Chequerfield Lane) and in the same straight line in continuation thereof for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of Willow Park Infant School and continuing thence first generally southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and then southeastwards along the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the last mentioned School to the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close number 8722 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close number 8413 to the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, from the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton

"(b) All that part of the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the northeast and the northwest of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, from the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, at the northwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as 12 Rook Hill Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the houses and premises on the southwestern side of Rook Hill Road to its end and continuing thence southeastwards along the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of the houses and premises known as 14 and 15 and 12 and 13 Church Balk Lane and in continuation thereof in the same straight line to the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of close number 7287 (thereby crossing the footpath between Church Balk Lane and Rook Hill Road) and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close number 7904 to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, from the parish of All Saints, Pontefract.

"(c) All that part of the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, from the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, in the middle of Church Balk Lane opposite to the middle of the northeastern end of Swan Hill Lane and continuing thence southwestwards to and southwestwards and westwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to its junction with Carleton Road and continuing thence first westwards to and then northwestwards along the middle of Carleton Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, from the parish of Pontefract.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton:—

"All that part of the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the southeast and the southwest by the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Michael, Carleton, from the parish of All Saints, Pontefract, at the southwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of the house and premises known as 12 Rook Hill Road and proceeding thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the southeastern end of the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as 10 Rook Hill Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the houses and premises on the southwestern side of Rook Hill Road and in continuation thereof in the same straight line to a point in the middle of
