TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF (1) CARTO-GRAPHICAL DRAUGHTSMAN OR SURVEYOR IN THE ORDNANCE SURVEY, AND (2) CARTOGRAPHER IN THE DIRECTORATE OF COLONIAL SURVEYS.

1. Both men and women are eligible, but the number of vacancies available for women may be restricted.

2. Age.

Category A.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 2I years of age on the governing date.

Category B. Candidates must be at least 21 and under 26 years of age on the governing date. But a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the governing date.

For a competition held in the first six months of any year the governing date for age will be 1st March of that year; for a competition held in the last six months of any year it will be 1st September of that year.

3. Refund of Marriage Gratuity.

Married women who have formerly been estab-Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before the 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately fol-lowing the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

- (a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth
 - (i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic,
 - (ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:
- (b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:
- (c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

The candidates in each Category will be arranged in order of merit on their total marks in the examina-tion. The vacancies available will be offered to candidates in order of merit, and in accordance with their wishes as to the Department in which they prefer to be appointed. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, however, no candidate will be appointed who does not reach a standard which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers, elsewhere than in England and Wales, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. Assignment.

When the results of the examination are published, successful candidates will be asked to state their order of preference between the two Departments. No alteration to this order of preference will be allowed. Candidates will be assigned to the vacancies available, in order of merit, according to their statement of preference. A candidate expressing a preference for one Department only, but for whom there is no vacancy available, will remain on a waiting list during the currency of the competition in case

any additional vacancy arises in the Department of his choice for which he can be considered.
