RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING WAGES COUNCIL (ENGLAND AND WALES).

The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (England and Wales) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration as set out in the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation Order, 1953 (Order R.B.(42)) as amended by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1956 (Order R.B.(48)) and (2) revoking Order R.B.(42) and Order R.B.(48).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it not later than 14th January, 1957. The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:-

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF (1) CARTOGRAPHICAL DRAUGHTSMAN OR SURVEYOR IN THE ORDNANCE SURVEY, AND (2) CARTOGRAPHER IN THE DIRECTORATE OF COLONIAL SURVEYS.

1. Both men and women are eligible, but the number of vacancies available for women may be restricted.

2. Age.

Category A.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 21 years of age on the governing date.

Category B.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 26 years of age on the governing date. But a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the governing date.

For a competition held in the first six months of any year the governing date for age will be 1st March of that year; for a competition held in the last six months of any year it will be 1st September of that year.

3. Refund of Marriage Gratuity.

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before the 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.
