

Dartmouth, March 2. On the first instant came into this Harbour the Hunter Privateer of Guernsey, Captain Richard Robinson Commander; who, on the 25th past, sent in here a Dogger laden with Wine from Bourdeaux: The same Privateer hath since taken another Dogger laden with Wine from Bourdeaux, and hath sent her to Guernsey.

Plimouth, March 4. On the 2d instant came into this Port, the Marlborough, William Mills Master, with a Prize laden with Wine from Bayonne. The same day came in here from London, the Radnor, Morgan Williams Master, and the Sarah and Dorithy, John King Master.
