PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of March, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter, (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Cadbury with Stockleigh Pomeroy in the diocese of Exeter.

“Whereas in pursuance of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 29th day of March, 1935, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of April, 1935, the benefice of Cadbury and the benefice of Stockleigh Pomeroy were, with effect from the 17th day of September, 1940, united into one benefice with cure of souls, but the parishes of the said benefices continued distinct in all respects:

“And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved and that the said benefice of Cadbury should be held in plurality with the benefice of Thorverton and that the said benefice of Stockleigh Pomeroy should be held in plurality with the benefice of Shobrooke, all of which benefices are in the said diocese of Exeter:

“And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the dissolution of the said union by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said pluralities by subsequent Orders made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

“SCHEME

“1. *Disunion of benefices.* The union of the benefice of Cadbury and the benefice of Stockleigh Pomeroy in the said united benefice of Cadbury with Stockleigh Pomeroy shall be dissolved and the said benefices shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

“2. *Taking effect of disunion.* The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the

day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

“3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the disunion taking effect the parsonage house of the said united benefice shall belong to the separate benefice of Cadbury and shall be the house of residence of the incumbent thereof.

“4. *Patronage.* After the disunion has taken effect the patronage of each of the separate benefices of Cadbury and Stockleigh Pomeroy shall belong to and be exercisable by the patron or his successor in title to whom it belonged immediately before the taking effect of the said union.

“5. *Distribution of Endowments.* Upon the disunion taking effect the endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, (a), a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £213 16s., being part of a larger capital sum held by us for the said united benefice, shall be assigned and annexed to the separate benefice of Stockleigh Pomeroy and (b), all other the endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the separate benefice of Cadbury.”

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of All Souls with Saint Peter and Saint John, Saint Marylebone and Saint Marylebone with Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone, both in the diocese of London.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered
