"1. *Constitution:*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Stephen the Martyr, Rednall'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:*

"The district (and parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Birmingham and in the rural deanery of King's Norton.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All that part of the district of Saint Chad, Rubery, which is bounded upon the north partly by the parish of Saint Bartholomew, Allens Cross, and partly by the parish of Northfield, upon the east by the parish of King's Norton, upon the south by the parish of Cofton Hackett, upon the southwest by the parish of The Lickey and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of The Lickey from the parish of Saint Chad, Rubery, in the middle of Leach Green Lane opposite the middle of the eastern end of Eachway Lane and proceeding thence generally northwestwards along the middle of Leach Green Lane to its end on the southern side of Bristol Road South and continuing thence in a straight line northwestwards across Bristol Road South to a point in the middle of Cock Hill Lane opposite the middle of Callow Brook and continuing thence northeastwards to, then first generally northeastwards then southeastwards along the middle of Callow Brook for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading northeastwards from Bristol Road across Callow Brook to and beyond the railway line of British Railways which runs from Longbridge to Halesowen and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the said footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Chad, Rubery, from the parish of Saint Bartholomew, Allens Cross, in the middle of the said railway line."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of King's Norton in the diocese of Birmingham.

SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:
