

Act, 1874, and of the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (in witness whereof he has signed and sealed the same), with respect to two of the rural deaneries within the Archdeaconry of Rochester in the diocese of Rochester.

“SCHEME.

“As from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order there shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Gillingham in the Archdeaconry of Rochester the district of Wigmore with Hempstead now in the Rural

Deanery of Rochester within the same Archdeaconry.”

And whereas the provisions of the said Acts, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

WHEREAS the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Chevening, in the County of Kent, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Chevening in the said County of Kent, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:-

*Chevening.*—Forthwith and entirely in that part of the Churchyard of St. Botolph's Church, in the said Parish of Chevening, coloured pink on the plan annexed hereto.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 15th day of May next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 15th day of May.
