"SCHEDULE XVI—RE-ENGAGEMENT BOUNTIES

- "1. The bounty of £100 is to be discontinued as from 21st February, 1956, except that the following classes of ratings are to continue to be entitled to receive the Bounty when they re-engage for pension under the regulations existing before the 1st April, 1956. Transfer from a continuous service engagement to a 14-year engagement is to extinguish this reserved right.
 - "(a) All men who were serving on a 12 years' continuous service engagement on or before the 21st March, 1956, subject to (b) below.
 - "(b) All Boys and Juniors Royal Navy and Royal Marines, who were serving on 20th February, 1956, and who remain on their continuous service engagements and Artificer Apprentices and Artificers who were serving on 20th February, 1956."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her

Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
