ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933—

10. St. George's Street.
11. Church Street.
12. Cresswell Street.
13. St. Mary's Street.
14. The Paragon.
15. Lower Park Street.
16. Park Road.
17. Upper Park Road.

Nothing in the said Order shall prevent the driving of any vehicle belonging to Messrs. D. J. Morrison, Motor Coach Proprietors, Deer Park Garage, Tenby, and proceeding to their premises in Upper Frog Street along (a) that length of Paragon which lies between its junction with St. Florence Parade and its junction with Lower Frog Street; (b) Lower Frog Street; (c) Upper Frog Street; (d) that length of White Lion Street which lies between its junction with Upper Frog Street and its junction with South Parade; and nothing in the said Order shall prevent the driving of vehicles conveying persons staying at the Cliff Norton Hotels along the length of The Norton which lies between the said Cliff Norton Hotels and its junction with St. John's Hill.

*The Brixworth Rural (Brington No. 1) Diversion Order, 1957.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 28th day of March, 1957, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the hamlet of Nobottle in the Parish of Brington in the County of Northampton.

The effect of the Order will be:—

Firstly to extinguish the public right of way over a section of that Bridle Road of undefined width in the hamlet of Nobottle in the parish of Brington which leads in a south-easterly direction from the Nobottle to Duston Road to a point on the common boundary between the parishes of Brington and Hanpole, commencing at a point in Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 332 on the Ordnance Survey Plan (1926 Edition) where it joins the Nobottle to Duston Road leading in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 967 yards to a point on the common boundary between Ordnance Survey Parcel Nos. 353 and 368 on the said Ordnance Survey Plan, between the points marked "A" and "B" on the map annexed to the Order and thereon coloured brown and to substitute therefor a public right of way of
