"And whereas we consider that Lieutenants should receive further increments of full pay after eight years in the rank: "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, with effect from the first day of January, 11957, the following extension to the scale of full pay for Lieutenants, Royal Navy, laid down in paragraph 1 (a) of Schedule II of Order in Council dated the first day of November, 1956:— Daiby Rate

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of March, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:— "We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the interest hereinafter mentioned in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation

to the church and oure (hereinafter called 'the said united benefice') of East Stratton with Woodman-cote and Popham in the County of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Edward Maurice Ford, of Cobley Ford, Micheldever Station, in the County of Southampton, Retired Farmer, Victor Frank Sandy for-merly of Walnut Tree Cottage, North Warnborough, in the said County of Southampton but now of 'Oakengates', Hartley Wintney, in the same County, Corn Merchants Clerk, Kathleen Mary Smith for-merly of the Old Vicarage, but now of Dunley, Popham, in the said County of Southampton, Spinster, and John Frederick Smith formerly of Westminster Nursery, Newport, in the Isle of Wight, but now of Avenue Road Nurseries, Sandown, in the Isle of Wight, Nursery Gardener, as the Executors of the Will of the late Frederick James Smith, are entitled to exercise the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said mited benefice. "And whereas the said Edward Maurice Ford, Victor Frank Sandy, Kathleen Mary Smith and John Frederick Smith desire to transfer their said interest in the advowson of the said united benefice to the "Whereas we are satisfied that Edward Maurice Ford,

have executed the same): "And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of

will tend to make better provision for the cure or souls: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said Edward Maurice Ford, Victor Frank Sandy, Kathleen Mary Smith and John Frederick Smith in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said united benefice shall be transferred to the said Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishoprio and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.
