REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF MEDICAL OFFICERS IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

1. Both men and women may compete, except that in the Prison Commission the vacancies are for men only.

2. Age. Candidates must be at least 28 years of age on 1st May, 1957. There is no upper age limit, but in appointing persons in a permanent capacity Dein appointing persons in a permanent capacity De-partments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and the Commissioners will take this requirement into account.

3. Nationality.

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy
