ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930—SECTION 46 (1).

ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933—SECTION 29 (4).

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 4th day of April, 1957, the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation confirmed the County of Northampton (Roads Restriction) (No. 10) Order, 1956.

The effect of the Order (which may be inspected at the offices of the undersigned) is to prohibit the riding of any pedal cycle on the following footpaths in the parish of Roade:—
