WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.

AERATED WATERS WAGES COUNCIL (ENGLAND AND WALES).

The Aerated Waters Wages Council (England and Wales) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Aerated Waters Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation Order, 1955 (Order A. (53)) as amended by the Aerated Waters Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1956 (Order A. (55)) and (2) the revocation of Orders A. (53) and A. (55).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 10th May, 1957. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF (1) CARTOGRAPHICAL DRAUGHTSMEN IN CERTAIN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, (2) CARTOGRAPHICAL DRAUGHTSMEN OR SURVEYORS IN THE ORDNANCE SURVEY, (3) CARTOGRAPHERS IN THE DIRECTORATE OF COLONIAL SURVEYS.

1. Both men and women may compete, but in the Ordnance Survey the number of vacancies for women may be restricted.

2. Candidates who by the date of their application have had at least two years' experience of the work of a cartographical draughtsman will be regarded as trained candidates.

3. Age.

Untrained candidates must be at least 16 years of age at the date of application and under 25 years of age on 1st March, 1957, except that candidates

applying for posts in the Geological Survey and Museum (Department of Scientific and Industrial Research) must be at least 16 years of age at the date of application and under 21 years of age on 1st March, 1957. But a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March, 1957.

Trained candidates—there is no upper age limit for these candidates, but in appointing persons in a permanent capacity Departments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and the Commissioners will take this requirement into account.

4. Refund of Marriage Gratuity

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before the 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

5. Nationality.

(1) To be eligible for appointment (other than to a situation in the Admiralty or War Office) a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth:—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment.

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

(2) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Admiralty or War Office unless (i) at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and (ii) he was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and (iii) each of his parents was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times from birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may, if the conditions specified in paragraph (1) of this Regulation are satisfied, be admitted to appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty or the Secretary of State for War, as the case may be.

6. Educational Qualifications.

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (c) below, candidates must, by the date on which they submit their application forms, possess one of the following educational qualifications:

(i) A General Certificate of Education with passes at the Ordinary (or a higher) level in at least three of the following subjects:
