TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949.

*Hopperton Station, Allerton, Improvements.*

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949,

(a) to provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on the London—Edinburgh—Thurso Trunk Road approximately 63 yards north-west of the entrance to the premises known as New Inn Farm near Hopperton Station, Allerton, in the West Riding of Yorkshire in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 113 yards to a point on the western side of the route of the new trunk road to be constructed at Hopperton Station in pursuance of the London—Edinburgh—Thurso Trunk Road Road (Armytage Wood and other Diversions) Order, 1938;

(b) to provide for the stopping up of a length of approximately 23 yards of Grey Thorn Lane from its junction with the said Trunk Road and for the stopping up of a length of the said Trunk Road to be superseded by the said new trunk road at its northern end.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation, 21-37, Hereford Road, London, W.2, and at the offices of the West Riding of Yorkshire C.C. County Hall, Wakefield, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Copies of the Order, the title of which is "The London—Edinburgh—Thurso Trunk Road (Hopperton Station, Allerton, Improvements) Order, 1957", can be obtained from the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation, Stationery Section, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 14th day of May, 1957, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

PROHIBITION OF WAITING.

*Weybridge, Surrey.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation has made "The London Traffic (Prohibition of Waiting) (Wakton and Weybridge) Regulations, 1957" (S.I. 1957 No. 792), coming into operation on the 15th day of May, 1957, which prohibit vehicles from waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on Brooklands Road, Weybridge, Surrey, between a point 112 yards north of its junction with Pinewood Road and a point 189 yards north of that junction.

The Regulations contain exemptions to permit carrying out essential services and use by the local authorities in an emergency.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (DEFENCE PURPOSES) ACT,  
1951.

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation hereby gives notice of his intention to make an Order under subsections (1) and (12) of section 2 of the Supplies and Services (Defence Purposes) Act, 1951, the effect of which will be to revoke the Order made by him on the 3rd October, 1952, authorising the stopping up of the following length of road at Blyton in the parish of Blyton in the rural district of Gainsborough in the county of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey):—

That length of the road from Blyton to Northorpe which extends from a point approximately 550 yards east of its junction with the Blyton—Laughton Road in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 450 yards.

The said Order will be made not less than 21 days after the publication of this notice, i.e., not before 4th June, 1957.

RIVER BOARDS ACT, 1948.

Isle of Wight River Board.

*Isle of Wight Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, as applied by the River Boards Act, 1948, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the Isle of Wight River Board under section 4 (1) (b) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, providing for the alteration of the boundaries of the Isle of Wight Internal Drainage District.

The Scheme affects land in the Parishes of Brightstone, Shorwell and Ohale.

The Order will become final, and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-five days from the date of this notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall be subject to special parliamentary procedure.
