THE BURIAL GROUNDS (CHEVENING) ORDER, 1957 Made (17th May, 1957

## PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), as amended by subsequent enactments, make a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Chevening, in the County of Kent, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that

burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 15th March, 1957, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 15th day of May next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:


11. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Chevening save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Chevening—Forthwith and entirely in that part of the Churchyard of St. Botolph's Church, in the said Parish of Chevening, coloured pink on the plan annexed hereto.
