Vienna, Off. 7. The States of the lower Auftria are by his Imperial Majesties Order to assign convent-ent Winter Quarters for some Regiments of Horse and Foot, which are to be fent into that Country, to be in readinels upon any occasion, if the Turks should have a disposition to attempt or design any thing upon the Fron-

The Emperor has ordered the Count de Schaffgotz, his Ambassador in Peland, to continue there till some illue be put to the Marriage Treated of between the King of Poland

and the Emperors Sifter.

The faid King of Poland has made a Composition with Prince Ragotzi for the Tribute which was to be paid to the Crown of Paland for Transplusnias in lieu whereof he is contented to receive Fourhundred Waggon's Isden with Tockain Wines, which are reputed the best of Hingary; of which the Prince has already fent him

Three hundred men are ordered to march to Tockey, for the Recruits of the Regiment of Starenberg, who are by the Emperors Order and Alsignment to expect their pay

from the States of Lower-Auftria.

At Rainbonns, tis said, the States of the Empire have resolved upon the reformation of Moneys, and that the Act for that purpole waits only for his Imperial Majesties

consent.

The Chancelor of Hungary has made and figned a Refignation of his Charge, in lieu whereof his Imperial Majesty has conferred on him the Bishoprick of Agria, the late Bishop of that place, Monlegnior Pais, being removed thence to the Bishoptick of Moutra, and at the same time stryested in the vacater Chancellorship of Hone-

The Emperor having been informed that the German-Forces which were put into Candia, had much fignalized their Valors in the desence of that place, and gained a Freat Reputation even amongst their Enemies, was re-folved to make the Count de Calmansek, who Com-mands them, Major-General of his Forces, so soon as he

Venice, Offiod. 18. From Dalmatia they write, that a body of about 12 thousand Foot were by the Turks drawn together about Zettina, and 7 thousand Horse near Clivano, which gives no small jealousie to the whole Countrey of Dalmatia, their delign being not as yet published.

The R publick is lending Men and Moneys with Am-

munition and other necessaries for the supply of their Garrilons in those parts, though the peace which is so lately concluded, gives us confidence to believe that the Turks

will not suddenly violate their, agreement.

The Morlachs which lately made an incurlion into the Turkish Quarters, retured with a very confiderable booty of many Slaves and much Cattle.

The Armed Barks let out by the Christians, have lately taken an Armed Feluca of Dulcigno, with a Prize which the had feiled in the leas near Cattare.

Hague, Octob. 24. On Friday last arrived here the Heer de Groot from his Embelly and Negotiation in Swedeland; of which he has given an account with satisfaction to the States; as also of what passed worthy of Consideration in his Visits to the Dukes of Lunenbourg, but he took not Munster in his way as was formerly designed.

The Heer Meerman is recovered from his distempers but yet notiet forward for Bruffels.

The States have lately ordered in their Affembly, that all Commanders and Officers shall within three weeks be perfonally attending their respective Charges and Employ-ments. Commanding all such Officers as are abroad in Foreign parts to reepair to their Commands upon pain of being Cashiered the service.

They have farther ordered, that for the future no Officer shall have leave given him to absent himself above Six weeks from his Charge, if within the States jurisdiction, and that none, whose pecelifies shall oblige them to go in-to forreign Countreys, shall be Licensed for above the Term of Three Moneths, those who transfers to incur

the same penalty of looking their employments.

On the 14th of the next Month, the States intend to come to a full resolution about the Imposts which they defign to put upon forreign Merchandiles and Manufactures,

and more especially upon French Wines.

They intend speedily to make choice of some able person to be sent into Spain under the character of Ambas-fador. The reinsorcement of the several companies of the Militia is again warmly discoursed of 5 for the addition of 12000 men, but tis beleived may be yet deferred till March.

In the mean time the States have taken care to dilpatch leveral of their members to take a view of their Magazines, and to see them sufficiently furnished with all necessaries for Wart, as also to give order for the com-pleating of the Fortifications in all places, but especially upon the Frontiers. The Deputies of the Admiralty are daily expected here to confult with the States about the Marine affairs, and the state of the Fleet. From Amsterdam we are advited a that by the late
