At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 24th day of June, 1957.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of June, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the sinecure rectory (hereinafter called ‘the said sinecure rectory’) of Hazelbury in the County of Wilts and in the diocese of Bristol:—

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that John Bonham Kidston, of Breach Farm, Dummer, near Basingstoke, in the County of Southampton, Esquire, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said sinecure rectory:

“And whereas the said John Bonham Kidston desires to transfer the advowson of the said sinecure rectory to the Bishop of Bristol for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Box, being the parish in which the advowson or right of patronage of the said sinecure rectory arises or exists:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said sinecure rectory shall be transferred to the said Arthur Bishop of Bristol, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Bristol for the time being.”

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bristol.

REGULATION MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13 OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING REGULATIONS.

Schedule 2.

Examinations recognised by the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Architectural Education in accordance with section 6 (3) of the principal Act.

Amend Schedule 2 of the Regulations by the addition of the following words:—

“Department of Architecture, Kingston-upon-Thames School of Art, Diploma Final Examination.”
