APPLICATION FOR THE MARKING OF CERTAIN IMPORTED WIRE GOODS COMMONLY USED FOR DOMESTIC AND CATERING PURPOSES.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they have discretion also to consider and report whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation importation.
