General Salisch has caufed 3 Camps to be marked out for our A:my, one at March en Famine, another at Velsimont near Huy, and the third at Viseme, in the District of Heshaye; which will probably give a Jealousie to the French, and induce them to recal part of the Fo ces which they were fending sowards the Moselle: There are Letters from P-ris of the 14th inftant, which fay, That the French had raifed the Siege of Gibraltar, contrary to the Opinino of the Spaniards, who infilted to have it continued; which in all likelyhood will not a little encrease the Divitions and Jealouties between the two Nations; And that the Marshal de Telle was returned to Madrid, having left 4000 Men under the Command of the Marquis de Thuy, posted upon the Hills and Passes near Gibraltar, to prevent the Garifons making Excurlions

into the Country.

Hagne, April 22. N. S. His Grace the Duke of Mailborough had this afternoon 4 Conference with the Deputies of the States General in his own Lodgings. The Preparations are continued for bringing our Forces into the Field. The Generals in the Service of this State held lately a Council of War; after which they had a Conference with the Duke of Marlborough. It is still faid that there is some Defign in hand to be executed on our Frontiers, which the French feem Apprehensive of, by the extraordinary Precautions they take for the securing of their Lines, and such of their Towns as lie most exposed. Monfieur Hop, who went lately to the Texel to review the Forces and the Recruits which are to be fent to Portugal, is returned hither, and has given an Account rortugal, is returned fitter, and has given an receive to the States General of the Condition wherein he found them. It is faid, That Admiral Al'emonds, who is to Command the Squadron on Board which they are Embarked, will go on Board the 29th instant, and set Sail without any surther Delay, with the first fair Wind. The Answerp Gazette gives an Account. That they had News at Paris of the Surrender of Verue, and of the railing of the Siege of Gibraltar; but neither the Paris Gazette mentions it, nor the witten News from thence; which bring Advice, That the Duke de Bretagne, Son of the Duke of Burgundy, is lately Dead.
