THE IMPORT DUTIES (DRAWBACK) (No. 13) ORDER, 1957

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 5) Order, 1956, provided for the allowance of drawback of Customs duty paid on corks and wooden tops, when bottle stoppers incorporating both these articles were exported. The effect of the present Order is to extend that provision so as to enable drawback of Customs duty paid on corks to be allowed also on the exported. of bottle stoppers comprising corks and non-wooden

tops.

The Order comes into operation on the 23rd August, 1957, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1957, No. 1481.
