BRACKLEY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Brackley Rural District Council—Footpath at Evenley Diversion Order, 1956.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 27th day of August, 1957, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert that part of the public right of way leading from Evenley Hall Farm to the Banbury branch line of British Railways where it crosses Ordnance Parcel 248, to a route running from Hill Ground Spinney in a northerly direction along the existing track for a distance of approximately 363 yards then eastwards to the boundary of the field. The existing footpath will be extinguished on 8th October, 1957.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at Brackley Lodge, Brackley, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Saturdays—9 a.m. to 12 noon).

Chichester Rural District Council Eastergate Footpath Diversion Order, 1957.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Eastergate.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF EPPING AND ONGAR (MURRELLS FARM, STANFORD RIVERS) DIVERSION ORDER, 1956.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 21st day of August, 1957, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order with modifications.

The effect of the order is:—

1. to extinguish a public right-of-way commencing at a point on the westerly side of the Ongar—Abridge Road (A.113) at the entrance to Murrells Farm, Stanford Rivers, and running in a north-westerly direction through O.S. Enclosures 592, 358 and 357 for a distance of approximately 2,140 feet, and

2. to create a new public right-of-way on foot and on horseback commencing at a point on the westerly side of the Ongar—Abridge Road (A.113), a distance of approximately 740 feet north east of the entrance to Murrells Farm, Stanford Rivers, and extending in a north-westerly direction, inside the south western boundary of O.S. Enclosure 419, for a distance of approximately 1,040 feet, and continuing from the most southerly corner of O.S. Enclosure 416, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 450 feet to a point approximately 90 feet from the westerly corner and on the boundary between O.S. Enclosures 416 and 360 and then extending in a westerly direction across O.S. Enclosure 360 for a distance of approximately 600 feet, rejoining the old right-of-way at the most westerly corner of this last mentioned enclosure. Farm gates will be erected at four points on the new path as indicated on the map contained in the order confirmed by the Minister.

The old path will be closed on the 19th September, 1957.

A certified copy of the order and the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, 209, High Street, Epping, and will be open for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.
