

their Cannon began to gall his Horse, he thought fit to quit his Enterprize the next morning, and marched to Deuxpoints, a Place of no Defense, in hopes to have surpris'd 3 German Regiments which were quartered there; but upon notice of his March they retired; and the Enemy plundered the Town, and set fire to several Villages belonging to the King of Sweden. The Marshal is since returned to his former Quarters, after having greatly fatigued his Troops, especially the Horse, lost one Piece of Cannon in passing a River, and about 1000 Foot and 300 Horse, most of them by Desertion. There are Advices, That Prince Eugene passed through Inspruck the 22d past, going Post to Italy, to put himself at the head of the Imperial Army there.

Yarmouth, April 27. Yesterday sailed out of our Road a Fleet of light Colliers, bound for Newcastle.
