“Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided and (2) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Poulton-le-Fylde and Saint Mark, Blackpool should be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the map thereto annexed:

“And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part I of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

“1. *Constitution of New District.*

“(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in Part I of the said Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

“(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"All those parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Poulton-le-Fylde; Saint John, Blackpool; Christ Church, Blackpool; Saint Mark, Blackpool; bounded on the northwest by the parish of Saint Stephen, Blackpool and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Stephen, Blackpool from the parish of Poulton-le-Fylde, opposite the northern end of the eastern boundary of close number 301 and proceeding southwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and the eastern boundaries of closes numbered 302, 303 and 306 and in the same straight line to the middle of Westfield Avenue and thence eastwards along the middle of the said Avenue to the point opposite the northern end of the eastern boundary of close number 327 and thence southwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to a point where it meets the northern boundary of the house and premises known as number 41 Kendal Avenue and thence eastwards along the last mentioned boundary and along the northern boundaries of the houses and premises known as numbers 43 and 45 Kendal Avenue to the western end of the northern boundary of close number 209 and thence eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the western boundary of the house and premises known as number 417 Blackpool Old Road and thence northwards and thence eastwards along the western and northern boundaries of the last mentioned house and premises and thence eastwards to and thence generally southwards along the middle of Blackpool Old Road and southwards in continuation to a point in the middle of Poulton New Road and thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the point where it crosses the unnamed road leading from High Furlong Farm to School Farm and thence generally southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned unnamed road to the point where it meets the northern end of the southwestern boundary of close number 231 and thence southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary and along the southwestern boundary of close number 229 to its end and thence northeastwards along the southeastern boundary of close number 229 to the northern end of the western boundary of close number 287 and thence southwards and southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the northwestern end of the southwestern boundary of close number 254 and thence southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to its end and thence in a straight line to the northwestern end of the northeastern boundary of close number 256 (thereby crossing close number 283) and thence southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to its end where it meets Normoss Road and thence southeastwards to and northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the point opposite the northwestern end of the southwestern boundary of close number 832 and thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and along the southwestern boundary of close number 56 and thence eastwards along the southern boundaries of closes numbered 56, 55 and 53 to Staining Old Road and thence southwards across the last mentioned road to the middle of the northwestern end of the unnamed stream or brook running along the northeastern boundary of close number 59 and thence generally southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream or brook to the point where it meets the Municipal Borough boundary and thence southeastwards in a straight

line to the northern end of the western boundary of close number 173 and thence southwards along the last mentioned boundary and the western boundaries of closes numbered 178 and 224 to their end on the northern boundary of close number 223 and thence in a straight line to the northern end of the eastern boundary of close number 239 and thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary and the eastern boundary of close number 257 to the boundary which divides the parish of Poulton-le-Fylde from the parish of Saint Paul Marton and thence generally westwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where it crosses the middle of Lawson Road and thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road and in the same straight line to and northeastwards along the middle of Park Drive to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Blackpool, from the parish of Poulton-le-Fylde and thence northwestwards, northeastwards, southeastwards and eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where it crosses the middle of Park Drive and thence generally northwestwards along the middle of Park Drive to the southern corner of close number 417 and thence northwestwards and southwestwards along the southeastern and northwestern boundaries of close number 417 to the point opposite the middle of Alwood Avenue and thence northwestwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned avenue to Newton Drive and thence in the same straight line to and northeastwards along Newton Drive thereby following in part the boundaries dividing the parish of Saint John, Blackpool, and the detached part of Christ Church, Blackpool, from the parish of Saint Mark, Blackpool, to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mark Blackpool, from the parish of Poulton-le-Fylde and thence northwestwards along the last mentioned boundary to its junction with the southeastern boundary of close number 366 and thence southwestwards along the same boundary to its end and in the same straight line to the centre of St. Walburgha's Road and thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the southern end of Rodwell Walk and thence northeastwards to and northwards along the middle of Rodwell Walk to its junction with Argosy Avenue and thence northwestwards across Poulton New Road to the middle of the southeastern end of Plymouth Road and thence northwestwards along the middle of Plymouth Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Poulton-le-Fylde from the parish of Saint Stephen, Blackpool.

"Territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Mark, Blackpool:—

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Poulton-le-Fylde lying to the west of the area described in Part I of this Schedule."

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area and the church of The Ascension therein has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and is intended to be consecrated:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Blackburn, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Harry, Bishop of Oxford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Soulbury and the benefice of Stoke Hammond, both situate in the diocese of Oxford.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Soulbury and the benefice of Stoke Hammond shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Soulbury with Stoke Hammond' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Soulbury shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stoke Hammond together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied by us as follows, that is to say:—

"(a) so much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as we, after consultation with the bishop for the time being of the said diocese shall deem necessary, shall be applied by us towards the cost of carrying out improvements to the parsonage house of the united benefice, and

"(b) the balance (if any) of the said net proceeds shall be held by us on behalf of the united benefice as endowment capital and subject to the provisions of the Benefices (Stabilization of Incomes) Measure, 1951.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Stoke Hammond having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Buckingham and the rural deanery of Bletchley."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

POST OFFICE OVERSEAS TELEGRAMS

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the rates of charge and routes available for telegrams from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands to places abroad will, from the 1st October, 1957, be as shown in the tables hereunder.

Every service in respect of which a charge appears in the tables is at present available. Where no charge is indicated under any heading in respect of a particular destination the relative service is not at present available. The services available to particular destinations abroad are, however, liable to be suspended and the restrictions imposed are liable to be varied from time to time by any of the telegraph administrations and private operating agencies concerned. Subject to any such restrictions telegrams may be sent to every one of the destinations in the appropriate table over the routes specified.

Except where otherwise stated the service of urgent telegrams is available at a rate per word equal to twice the rate per word for a telegram to the same destination over the same route sent at the ordinary rate.

Where the total amount of the charge for a telegram would include an odd number of farthings the charge is raised to the next higher halfpenny.

The service of delivery on ornamental forms (LX) is available to the destinations indicated.

The route abbreviations "Govt." or "Imperial" or "via Ldn. C.T.O." signify that the telegram is dealt with in the U.K. by the Post Office. The route abbreviations "Commercial", "Northern", "P.Q." and "Western Union" signify that the telegram is handed over in the U.K. by the Post Office to the Commercial Cable Company, the Great Northern Telegraph Company, the French Telegraph Cable Company or the Western Union Telegraph Company respectively, for further treatment.
