He continued dangeroully ill all day, but by the Help of proper Medicines be has in tome measure recovered his Appetite, and rested pretty well last night, and this morning his Swelling is much abared; fo that it is very probable his Imperial Majesty may recover. The 22d Instant the Count de Lewenstein went from hence towards Bavaria, to take Possession of his Place of Administrator of that Electorate; and he will shortly be followed by Count Lamberg and Count Sease. The 23d the new Regiment of Dragoons raised in Bavaria by Major General Feliz came down from Lintz by Water; to morrow they will be reviewed by the King of the Remans, and will then continue their March towards Han-
