

"2. The net proceeds arising from such sale or sales, after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Derby established pursuant to the said Measures.

"3. The furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint James, Buxton, or such of them as the said Bishop shall select, shall be transferred to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the said Bishop may direct or shall (with the exception of the font, communion table and plate used for the purposes of the Holy Communion) be sold, and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the proceeds of the sale of the site and materials of the said church.

"4. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette, certain sums of Stock held by the Derby Diocesan Board of Finance (hereinafter called 'the said Board'), that is to say

"(a) a sum of £152.17s. 3d. $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. War Stock held by the said Board pursuant to a Declaration of Trust dated 7th April, 1913, made between the Reverend Charles Coddington Nation, John Willoughby, Godfrey Davenport Goodman and the Southwell Diocesan Finance Association and to a deed dated 15th December, 1931, appointing the said Board trustee in place of the Southwell Diocesan Finance Association upon trust to apply the income thereof towards the repair and maintenance, and the capital towards the rebuilding, reconstruction or enlargement, of the said church of Saint James, Buxton;

"(b) a sum of £206 5s. 7d. 3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70) held by the said Board pursuant to the Will of the late Maria Heaford upon trust to apply the income thereof for the benefit of the said church;

"(c) a sum of £1,157 5s. 0d. 3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70) held by the said Board pursuant to the Will of the late Frederick Lewis Burkill upon trust to apply the income thereof for the purposes of the said church;

shall be applied for the like purposes or objects for the benefit of or in connection with the parish church of the parish of Buxton the church of Saint Mary the Virgin and the church of Saint Anne all in the benefice of Buxton or any one of the said churches."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of September, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) for (1) effecting the union of the parish of Saint Alphege with Saint Mary, Northgate, and All Saints, Canterbury, and the parish of Saint Margaret with Saint Andrew and Saint Mary, Bredman, Canterbury, being the parishes of the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, and (2) for authorising the appropriation of the church of Saint Margaret, Canterbury, to other uses, which said parishes and benefice are situate in the diocese of Canterbury.

"SCHEME.

"1. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the parish of Saint Alphege with Saint Mary, Northgate, and All Saints, Canterbury, and the parish of Saint Margaret with Saint Andrew and Saint Mary, Bredman, Canterbury, shall, with the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Charles Magraw being the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, be permanently united together and form one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury'.

"2. The parish church of Saint Alphege, Canterbury, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"3. Upon the union of parishes taking effect the church of Saint Margaret, Canterbury, shall be appropriated to the use specified in the Schedule hereto but subject to the conditions so specified.

"4. The font, communion table, plate, vestments and other furnishings and articles of the said church of Saint Margaret, Canterbury, shall be transferred to the diocesan authority (as defined in the Schedule hereto) for use in the said church in connexion with its appropriation to the use specified in the said Schedule; Provided that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the said diocesan authority, with the consent of the Archbishop of Canterbury, from otherwise disposing of the organ in the said church.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The diocesan board of finance of the diocese of Canterbury or the body appointed by the Diocesan Conference to act as trustees of diocesan trust property (hereinafter called 'the diocesan authority') shall permit the church of Saint Margaret, Canterbury, to be used by the Committee of the Association for the Deaf as an institute for the spiritual, recreational and social welfare of the deaf.

"2. The said Committee of the Association for the Deaf shall be wholly responsible for the repair and maintenance of the church and its furniture, fittings and contents to the satisfaction of the architect of the diocesan authority and for all other expenses in connexion with its use as aforesaid; and shall reimburse to the diocesan authority any expenditure which the diocesan authority as the legal owners of the church may incur including the amount of the premium of any policy of insurance which the diocesan authority may effect on the church and its furniture, fittings and contents or against public liability.

"3. The said Committee of the Association for the Deaf shall not effect or permit to be effected any alterations in or additions to the fabric of the church except with the consent of the diocesan authority and in accordance with and subject to lawful authority.

"4. The diocesan authority may enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Committee of the Association for the Deaf upon consequential and ancillary matters in connexion with the appropriation and use of the church, not being repugnant to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme.

"5. Nothing herein contained shall affect or diminish the jurisdiction of the Consistory Court of the diocese in respect of the church.

"6. The diocesan authority shall not dispose of the freehold of the church."
