HAYES AND HARLINGTON SMOKE CONTROL ORDER No. 3, 1957.

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Hayes and Harlington in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the abovementioned Act on the 15th day of October, 1957, made an Order entitled the Hayes and Harlington Smoke Control Order No. 3, 1957, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation. confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding \$100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthra-cite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and
