

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoing in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of October, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice of Greenhithe (now vested in the Bishop of Rochester, in right of his See) for the patronage of the benefice of Saint Thomas, Southborough, (now vested in The Church Society Trust of Dean Wace House, 7, Wine Office Court, Fleet Street, London, and the Reverend Canon Thomas Leslie Livermore of The Rectory, Morden, Surrey, as trustees) both of which benefices are situate within

the diocese of Rochester, and we do hereby certify that we have made due inquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set forth in the Schedule to the said Scheme.

"SCHEME.

"With the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), of The Church Society Trust (in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their Common or Corporate seal), and of the Reverend Canon Thomas Leslie Livermore (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme) the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Greenhithe shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Church Society Trust and the said Reverend Canon Thomas Leslie Livermore, and in exchange for the same the right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice of Saint Thomas, Southborough, shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Christopher, as Bishop of Rochester, and his successors in the same See.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of October, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Luke, Prestonville; Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton, and Saint Thomas, Hove, all situate in the diocese of Chichester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from

and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Luke, Prestonville; Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton, and Saint Thomas, Hove, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Luke, Prestonville, comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton, and Saint Thomas, Hove, which lie to the northeast of the middle of Dyke Road and to the northwest of the middle of Chatham Place and New England Road."
