the Foreign Service will not, however, count in deterin the order of merit in the examination. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not reach a standard that satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

Not more than one-third of the vacancies to be filled from the examination will be available for persons serving as Postal and Telegraph Officers in the Post Office.

8. Candidates trained as Teachers.
