EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

to indicate its general purport.) 1. This Order amends the Order of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by subsequent Orders. 2. The normal maximum rate of the allowances payable for constant attendance is increased from 30s. a week to 35s. a week in the case of ratings and the maxima, for exceptional cases of very severe disablement, from £156 a year to £182 a year in the case of officers and from 60s. a week to 70s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 2.) 3. The allowance for unemployable pensioners is increased from £117 a year in the case of officers and 45s. a week in the case of ratings to £143 a year and 55s. a week respectively. (Article 3.)

4.—(1) The additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving approved treatment is increased from totals of $\pounds 65$ a year in the case of officers and 25s. a week in the case of ratings to totals of $\pounds 78$ a year and 30s. a week respectively. (Articles 3 and 6.)

(2) The allowance for the first or only child of a (2) The allowance for the first of only child of a pensioner who has been awarded a special allowance either on the grounds of unemployability or because, during a course of approved treatment, he is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased to £39 a year in the case of the child of an officer and to 15s. a week in the case of the child of a rating. (Articles 3 and 6.)
