5. The maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation is increased from 27s. 6d. a week to 34s. a week. (Article 4.) 6. Provision is made for the award to persons entitled to two pensions of an age allowance at the rate appropriate to the degree of disablement which represents the combined effect of their pensioned disablements where this is to their advantage. (Article 5) (Article 5.)

7. The maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased from 40s. a week to 50s. a week. (Article 6.)

8. The maxima of the daily and weekly rates of allowances for part-time treatment are increased from 30s. and 40s. to 40s. and 65s. respectively.

9. The pension payable to unmarried dependants who have lived as wives of deceased members of the naval forces are increased from £141 a year in officer cases and 45s. a week in rating cases to £177 a year and 58s. 6d. a week respectively. (Article 9.)

10. The maximum of the rent allowance payable to certain widows is increased from 20s. a week to 25s. a week. (Article 10.)

11. The allowances payable to widows in respect of children are increased from £63 10s. a year to £73 a year in the case of officers, from £57 10s. a year to £67 a year in the case of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Warrant Officers and from 21s. 6d. a week to 25s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 12 (b).)

12. The rates of pensions or allowances payable to or in respect of the children of deceased members to or in respect of the children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mother) are increased from £99 10s. a year to £112 10s. a year in the case of children of officers, from £75 or £91 10s. a year to £88 or £104 10s. a year (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Warrant Officers and from 25s. or 35s. a week to 30s. or 40s. a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 12 (c) and 13.) 13. The rates of pensions payable to motherless

13. The rates of pensions payable to motherless children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of an infirmity which arose before they attained the normal

infimity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes, are increased from £104 a year to £130 a year in the case of children of officers and from 40s. a week to 50s. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Article 14.) 14. The maximum rates of disablement addition on a pension basis payable to certain officers in receipt of service retired pay are increased from £210 a year in the case of male officers and £185 a year in the case of women officers to £256 a year and £231 a year respectively. (Article 15.) 15. Articles 16, 17 and 18 substitute new Tables for those contained in the Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to the Order and have the general effect of providing—

of providing-

(a) for increasing the rates of pensions in respect of 100 per cent. disablement by £46 a year in the case of officers and by 17s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings and for the rates of pensions for lower degrees of disablement to be increased proportionately;
(b) for increasing awards for cases of minor injuries and other cases of less than 20 per cent. disablement :

(c) for increasing the rates of pensions for certain widows by £36 a year in the case of officers and by 13s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of November, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to saÿ:-

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pur-suance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the

boundaries of the parishes of All Saints, Squirrels Heath; Hornchurch; Saint Michael, Gidea Park, and Saint Alban, Romford, all situate in the diocese of Chelmsford.

## " SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford, consents to the proposed arrange-ments (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

Scheme): "Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commis-sioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of All Saints, Squirrels Heath; Horn-church; Saint Michael, Gidea Park, and Saint Alban, Romford, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

## "THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Michael, Gidea Park:---

"All that part (coloured pink on the map an-nexed hereto) of the parish of All Saints, Squirrels Heath, which lies to the north of the middle of the Chelmsford to Liverpool Street line of the British Railways (Eastern Region).

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Alban, Romford:—

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of All Saints, Squirrels Heath, which lies to the northeast of the middle of the Grays to Liverpool Street line of British Railways (Eastern Region) to the north-west of the middle of Brentwood Road and to the southwest of the middle of Balgores Lane.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of All Saints, Squirrels Heath:---

"The ferritory to be annexed to the parish of Au aints, Squirrels Heath:— "All that part (coloured mauve on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Hornchurch which lies to the north and west of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Hornchurch from the parish of All Saints, Squirrels Heath, in the middle of Ardleigh Green Road at a point opposite the western end of the rear boundaries of the houses or premises situate on the northern side of Wood-land Avenue and thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary of close numbered 244 to the middle of the stream known as The Tributary of Ravensbourne Brook and thence in a straight line to the northern end of the western boundary of the house or premises numbered 19 Woodland Avenue and in continuation thereof eastwards along the rear boundary of the house or premises numbered 29, Woodland Avenue and thence northwards along the last mentioned boundary and eastwards to the eastern boundary of the house or premises numbered 33 Woodland Avenue and southwards along the last mentioned boundary to the northern boundary of the house or premises numbered 33 Woodland Avenue and southwards along the last mentioned boundary to the northern boundary of the house or premises numbered 33 Woodland Avenue and southwards along the last mentioned boundary to the northern boundary of the house or premises known as number 35 Woodland boundary to the northern boundary of the house or premises known as number 35 Woodland Avenue and eastwards along the last mentioned boundary and in continuation thereof to the middle boundary and in continuation thereof to the middle of Elm Grove and thence southwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of Sylvan Avenue thence east-wards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the southern end of the western boundary of the house or premises situate on the northern side of Sylvan Avenue numbered 3 Sylvan Avenue and thence northwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end and thence generally north-eastwards along the rear boundaries of the houses or premises situate on the northern side of Sylvan or premises situate on the northern side of Sylvan or premises situate on the northern side of Sylvan Avenue to the northern end of the eastern boundary of the house or premises numbered 23 Sylvan Avenue thence southwards along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of two chains to a point opposite the northern end of the eastern boundary of the house or premises numbered 27. Sylvan Avenue and thence in a straight line east-wards to the last mentioned boundary thereby crossing the right of way to Sheilings and continu-ing generally northeastwards along the rear
