

"And whereas the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Bosham; Chidham; Westbourne; Funtington with Sennicotts and Saint John the Evangelist, Southbourne, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Funtington with Sennicotts:—

"All that part of the parish of Westbourne (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the northeast of the middle of Hares Lane.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Chidham:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Funtington with Sennicotts (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the south of the middle of the London to Brighton line of the British Railways (Southern Region) and to the northwest of the middle of Newells Lane.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Southbourne (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto), which lies to the east of a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the last mentioned parish from the parish of Westbourne at a point in the middle of the aforesaid railway line opposite the northern end of the road or track known as Pottery Lane and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned road or track and in continuation thereof to the middle of the Emsworth to Chichester Road and thence in a straight line southeastwards to the north-eastern corner of close numbered 772 on the 25" Ordnance Map Sussex (West) Sheet LX8 Revision of 1932 continuing thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the last mentioned close and westwards and generally southwards along the northern and western boundaries of close numbered 795a and continuing thence in a straight line southwards to the northwestern corner of close numbered 770 (thereby crossing close numbered 771) and continuing thence in the same direction along the western boundary of close numbered 770 to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Southbourne, from the parish of Chidham.

"(c) All that part of the parish of Westbourne (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the south and east of a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the last mentioned parish from the parish of Funtington with Sennicotts at a point opposite the middle of the footpath which leads from the eastern corner of close numbered 304 on the 25" Ordnance Map Sussex (West) Sheet LX4 Revision of 1932 to Hambrook Hill and thence southwestwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to the middle of Hambrook Hill and continuing thence northwestwards to and along the middle of the road or track comprising close numbered 308 to a point opposite the northern end of the eastern boundary of close numbered 369 and thence southwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and thence westwards along the southern boundary of the last mentioned close to a point in the middle of the stream known as Ham Brook and thence generally southwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream to the boundary which divides the parish of Westbourne from the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Southbourne.

"3. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Southbourne:—

"All that part of the parish of Westbourne (coloured blue on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded on the south by the afore-mentioned railway line on the east by the territory annexed to the parish of Chidham in accordance with clause 2 (c) of this schedule and on the remaining sides by a continuous imaginary line commencing in the middle of the stream known as Ham Brook at the northeastern corner of close numbered 386 on the 25" Ordnance Map Sussex (West) Sheet

LX3 Revision of 1932 and continuing thence westwards to and along the northern boundary of closes numbered 386, 387 and 389 and continuing thence northwards, westwards and southwards along the eastern, northern and western boundaries of close numbered 278a to the northern boundary of close numbered 278c and continuing thence westwards along the last mentioned boundary and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of South Lane and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane and westwards along the lane which runs from South Lane to Stein Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the last mentioned road and westwards along the middle of Old Farm Lane to a point opposite the northern end of the western boundary of close numbered 396 and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and eastwards along the southern boundary of the last mentioned close to its junction with the eastern boundary of close numbered 398 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned boundary and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Southbourne, from the parish of Westbourne.

"4. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Bosham:—

"All that part of the parish of Funtington with Sennicotts (coloured yellow on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the east of the territory hereinbefore annexed to the parish of Chidham in accordance with clause 2 (a) of this Schedule and to the south of the middle of the railway line hereinbefore described."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme; and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

Schedule 2.

Examinations recognised by the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Architectural Education in accordance with section 6 (3) of the principal Act.

Amend Schedule 2 of the Regulations—

1. by the deletion of the words "Technical College, Cardiff," and the substitution thereof of the words "Welsh College of Advanced Technology."

2. by the addition of the words "The School of Architecture, Kingston-upon-Hull Regional College of Art and Crafts, Diploma (Final) Examination, followed by the Examination in Professional Practice and Practical Experience."
